Some have believed that buying war bonds and obtaining vital war work is the 100 percent contribution that both men and women can make in this war. That is a good beginning only.

Any worker, man or woman, can find employment today. If not in vital war work, at least in those occupations classified as "Essential." From the War Manpower Commission point of view (and this should be the right point of view of every clear-thinking American) it is necessary to staff, first, those vital war jobs. If you are in less-essential work or are unemployed, contact your local United States Employment Office. Those who cannot leave town are fortunate that it is possible for them to serve at home by taking an essential job.

Here Are Some FACTS

About jobs which the average person may or may not know. A Civil Service Representative is stationed permanently in Henderson to whom the local Employment Office refers workers to jobs of high national priority. These jobs are classified as "Must" openings and are for work in the shipyards on the West Coast, Pearl Harbor and the Norfolk Navy Yard. Workers, both men and women are also needed in Tennessee for one of the nation's largest war plants. These openings are urgent and there is a constant demand for workers of all types.
