

Canning Sugar Quota Will Be Sharply Cut

For the first time since the war began, the Federal Sugar Administration has announced a sharp cut in the quota of sugar to be used for canning. The quota for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1, 1945, has been set at 1,000,000 pounds, a decrease of 50 per cent from the 2,000,000 pounds authorized for 1944.

Therefore, the board said it would have to distribute the remaining amount as equitably as possible. This explanation is made so that applicants for canning sugar will understand why they cannot receive as much as requested, the board said.

Metz and others, in addition to General Jenkins. The civilian troopers and the band are expected back home on Sunday.

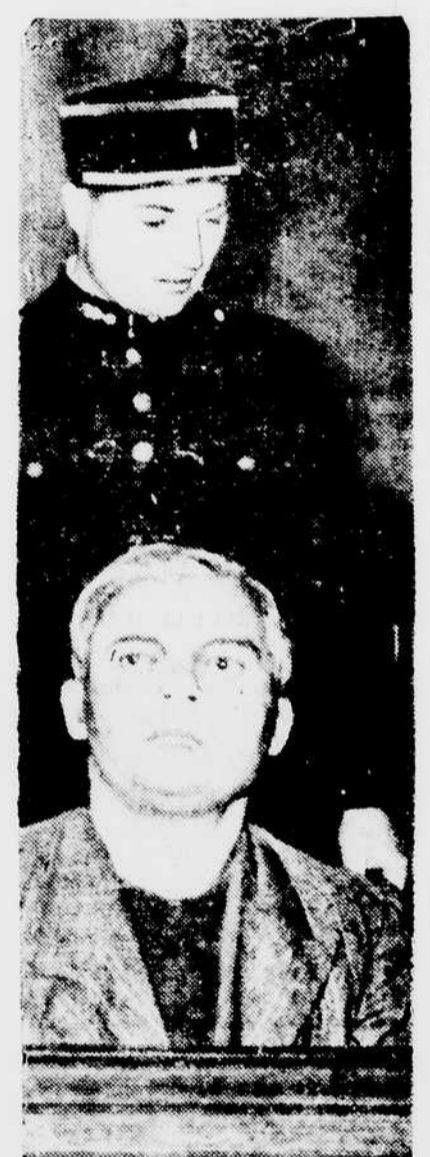
