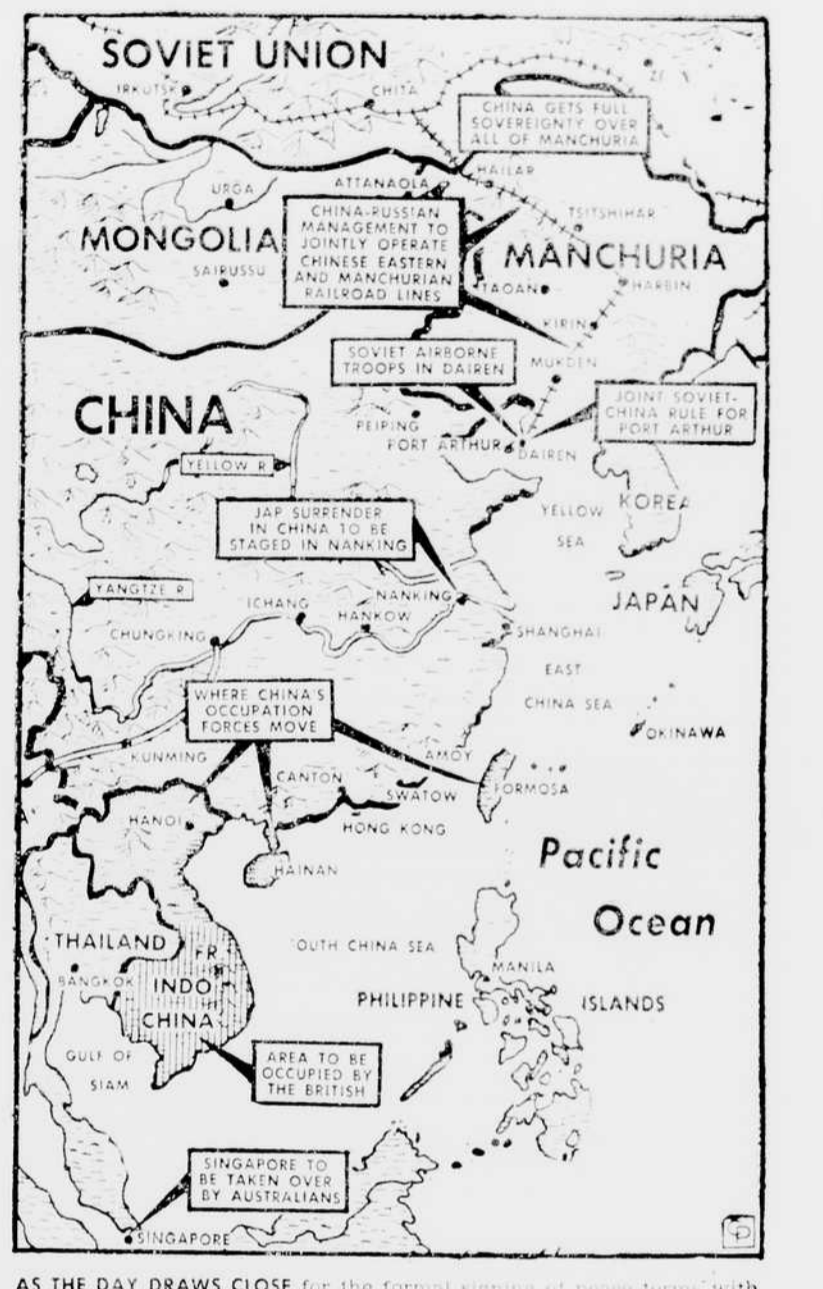
Arrival of Fleet Is As Peaceful As Maneuver at Home

Manila, Aug. 27.—(AP)—Designating the eighth army of Lt. Gen. Robert L. Eichelberger to occupy the Tokyo area, General MacArthur today announced there will be additional landings at Yokohama, Tokyo's port, and at Tateyama, outside Tokyo bay on the east side of its entrance.

Eichelberger, MacArthur said, will accompany the supreme Allied commander "when he arrives August 30" in Japan.

Strong American and British naval forces already are peacefully anchored in Sagami bay, within thirty miles of Tokyo.
