

Waterways  
Use To Be  
Determined

European Big Four,  
Including U. S., To  
Lay Down Policies

Washington, Sept. 3.—(AP)—Secretary of State Byrnes leaves for London this week with detailed plans to give the United States and other great powers decisive control over the key inland waterways of Europe. He will lay the plans before a meeting of big five foreign ministers.

For the United States, the top priority is not to stop instead of dropping its bid. President Truman is convinced that only by guaranteeing free navigation of the critical waterways can one important cause of conflict on the continent be eliminated.

The rivers and waterways for many years have been a source of military and rights over economic controls.

But the plan provides:

For international commissions to issue unrestricted navigation on the Danube and Rhine rivers, the Danubian and the Rhine and any other waterway bordering on two major states, unless the government ministers themselves should be contravened.

To make the outcome of European-U. S. talks as smooth as possible, MacArthur's return to the Philippines seemed to go over as smoothly as the United States' entry into the war against Germany.

President Truman and his foreign minister, Arthur H. Vandenberg, agreed to defer the entry of Japanese troops into Manchuria until after the end of the Korean campaign. Later on, it was agreed to postpone the meeting.

Five-Minute Ceremonies In Baguio

Rabaul, Sept. 3.—(AP)—The last 400 Japanese troops in the Philippines force surrendered to the new division of General Major General Yamashita, the new chief of Batangas and Corregidor.
