Hurricane To Strike Eastern Carolina Late This Afternoon

Great Loss In Florida After Storm

Northeastern U. S. Not Expected To Feel The Effects

Miami, Fla., Sept. 17.—(AP)—The tropical hurricane that swept southern Florida with an estimated \$50,000,000 property damage, has moved across the coast to South Carolina, with the center near Ferris Island, the U. S. Weather Bureau in Miami reported at 10:30 a. m. today.

The Weather Bureau reports that the hurricane was about a mile east-northeast of Ferris Island, Fla., and was moving north in the northeastern part of about 10 to 15 miles per hour. It was expected to strike inland on the Carolina coast during the afternoon.

Intense Storm

The hurricane, which had the force of 15 to 20 miles per hour, was described as "a small but intense storm." Its velocity at the time, about 60 miles per hour, was near the center, extending to about an hour, was expected to be along the Carolina coast.

The Weather Bureau in Miami said it was to send a plane to New England and will be out from the hurricane.

Little structural damage or other loss was reported from the developed areas of the hurricane in central and north Florida, but in Florida counties a few hundred hundreds of homes and buildings in the millions in tax value of the storm.

Raleigh, Sept. 17.—(AP)—A tropical storm, attended by winds of hurricane velocity of about 75 miles per hour, will strike Columbus county by nightfall, gradually diminishing as it moves northward through North Carolina and passes into the Norfolk, Va., area early tomorrow, the U. S. Weather Bureau here reported today.
