## ARMY TESTS 'WATER FOG' FOR PLANE CRASH FIRES



USING SIX DUMMIES to represent Army aviators who might have been caught in this spectacular inferno, the Air Transport Command's Ferrying Division demonstrates for the first time the use of the new "water fog" method of fighting gasoline fires resulting from plane crashes. This system "puffs" a fine mist of water down into millions of small particles and spreading it over a wide area, thus cooling the intense heat and aiding rescuers to save trapped aviators. Tokyo, Sept. 18.—(AP)—The defeated and nearly prostrate Japan, a new and long list of suspected war criminals is to be issued shortly.

For America, the largest carrier task force ever assembled is being formed into "Special Carrier Dividing Force" to speed the return of American fighters.
