One of the features of the fair will be the educational exhibits, in which the fair board has been successful in the past. The exhibits will be the most popular feature of the fair and will be even more so this year.





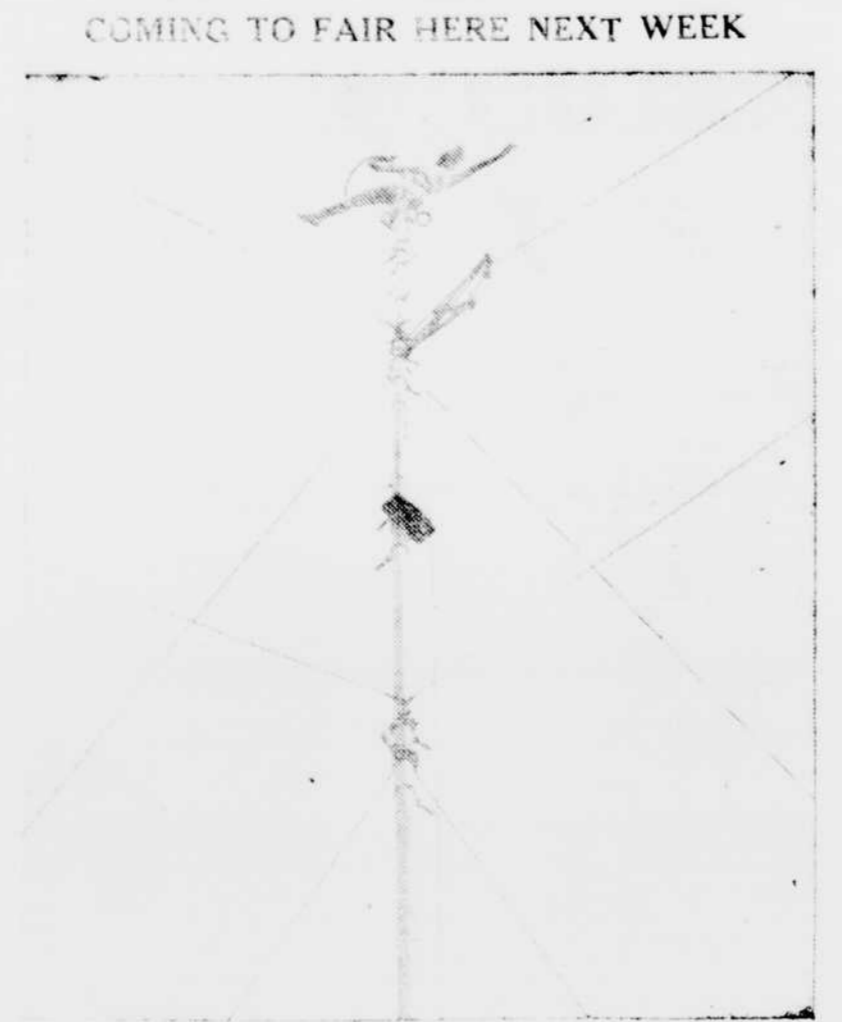

Judge Parker Presiding In Superior Court Here

Venire Exhausted To Get Grand Jury; Lane Is Foreman

Judge R. Hunt Parker, of Rutherford County, presiding judge of this third judicial district, opened a two-week session of Vance Superior Court here today the first week of trial of criminal actions and the second for civil cases.

A grand jury was chosen today with S. J. Lane, Jr., as foreman. In picking the grand jury, the judge drew 18 names from a list of 200 names by the county clerk. The venire was exhausted, and the court ordered a new venire of 100 names to be called from which to select veniremen to sit on cases tried during the week.

Twenty-four bills were drawn by Solicitor E. R. Tyler and presented to the grand jury for action, and in addition will draw appeals from lower courts to be tried by the grand jury at some future date. The bills included one on a charge of murder and one on a charge of rape.

In his charge to the grand jury, Judge Parker urged that they be diligent in all cases of criminal offenses, and that they be prompt in their decisions. He also urged that they be fair and impartial in their decisions.

After the court had been adjourned, a man named John Smith was arrested on a charge of public drunkenness. He was taken to the Henderson Police Station.

A 1930 Dodge automobile belonging to Sam Green, colored, was completely destroyed by fire on Saturday night on the Avenue road. The fire was reported by a neighbor.

Tobacco Men in Washington For Talks On Prices. Fred R. Yates, of Henderson, president of the Bright Leaf Warehouse Association, left here for the 24th annual meeting of the group and other businessmen of North Carolina were in Washington today for conferences with Charles E. Gage, tobacco specialist of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, with respect to the sharp drop in prices of certain grades in recent days.

George L. Eaton, colored, tried for reckless and careless driving, for operating a motor vehicle without an operator's license and for operating a motor vehicle with impaired vision, was fined \$25 and court costs.

Little Crews, colored, was tried for assault and sentenced to six months, suspended upon payment of a fine of five dollars and costs, and condition that she remain of good behavior for two years.

Will Spend \$1.500 At Middleburg

Commissioners To Provide Funding; Settle For Taxes

Authority for spending \$1,500 to build and heat the new agricultural building at Middleburg high school was voted by the Vance Board of County Commissioners today at their monthly meeting in Oxford.

The commissioners today approved the audit of the county tax collector's records for the 1944 levy and made final settlement with him and turned over to that office the new 1945 tax books for collection. A tentative 1944 settlement was made by the commissioners at the September meeting, and today's action was final.

Hitherto this season all tax payments have been made in the county account, and about \$20,000 has been received in advance payments. The audit of the books and accounts of the clerk of superior court was also received and accepted by the board.

The board approved a request of J. W. Sanders for improvement of the Powell's mill road, which runs into the Lyntank road in Kirtland with request that it assume responsibility for maintenance. The session was rather brief and ended by the noon hour.

Principals Allowed \$10 To Run Cars

At the request of Superintendent E. M. Rollins, the Vance Board of Education today approved payment of \$10 per month to principals of rural schools for use of their cars in carrying out their work. The payments will be for each of the nine months of the school year. There are five rural schools, and \$50 per month would be \$450 for the period. It was said the money would be "pinched" off available cash in the year's budget. The principals use their cars in trips to and from the city for books, and otherwise on business in connection with operation of the schools.
