

# Need Of War Fund Stated To Workers

**Campaign Is Begun With Over \$3,000 On \$15,700 Goal Given**

While exact figures were not immediately available, more than \$3,000 had been given in the United War Fund campaign for Vance county as general solicitations began today, Frank Jordan, general chairman, announced.

A rally of workers and the public in general was held at the auditorium of Henderson high school Monday night to advance the start of the active campaign, which follows last week's solicitations by advance gift workers. None of the latter have reported, it was said.

The goal of the cash solicitation is \$15,700.

J. L. Crompton, of Durham, campaign chairman for the district,

spoke at the meeting, and outlined to a roomful who the United War Fund was necessary and should be understood. He said millions of American soldiers are still overseas in occupational areas and with the hanging heels of their hands UNRRA is showing in getting into a trail for relief of suffering, and the war fund money will fill in the gaps and then the Germans pay everything in gold from conquered countries and give it to Germany, he speaks last.

Mr. Jordan presided of the meeting, and J. W. Jenkins gave a statement of aims and purposes of the campaign. He said that the goal of the campaign is to raise money to help the war effort.
