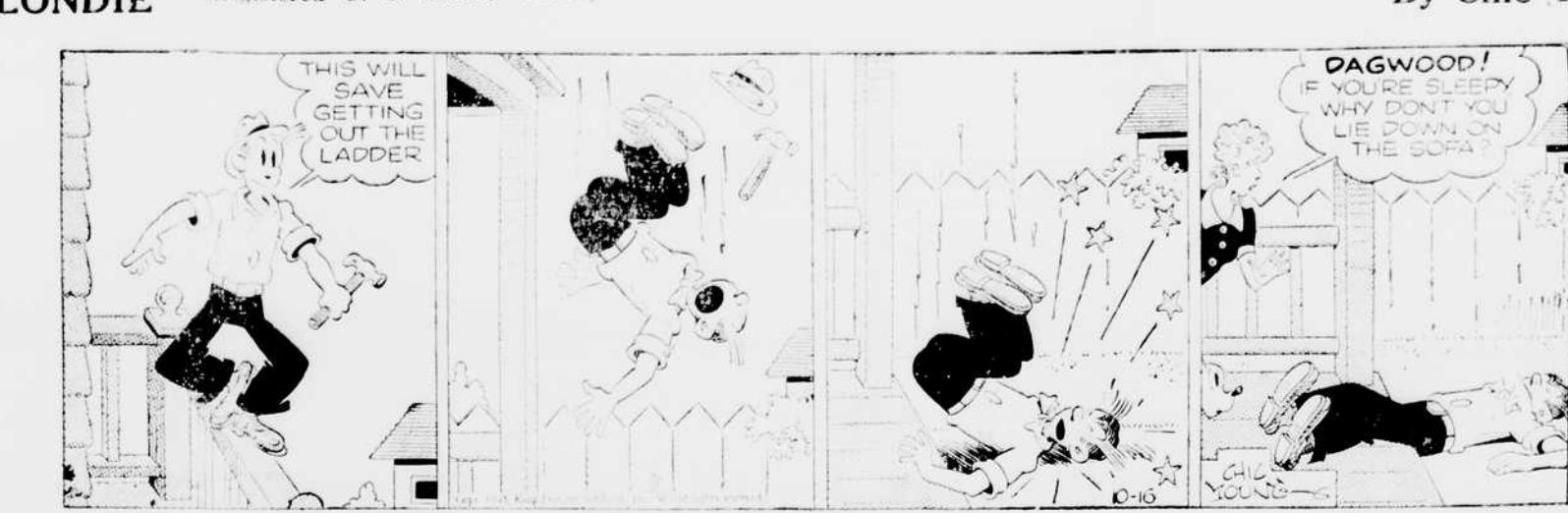

BETTER KNOW SQUEEZES
IF YOU PLAY match-point di-
rect and intend to seek an oc-
casional top score by playing a
grand slam hand in No Trumps,
instead of a suit it behooves you
to know your squeeze plays. In
some sizable percentage of grand
slam hands, the contract is easy
to make at the best-fitting suit
because of the chance to ruff a
trick or two. But in No Trumps,
you can't pick up tricks by ruffing.
So if you find only a dozen No
Trump tricks of the usual kind in
sight, a squeeze may be your only
chance to manufacture the thir-
teenth.
