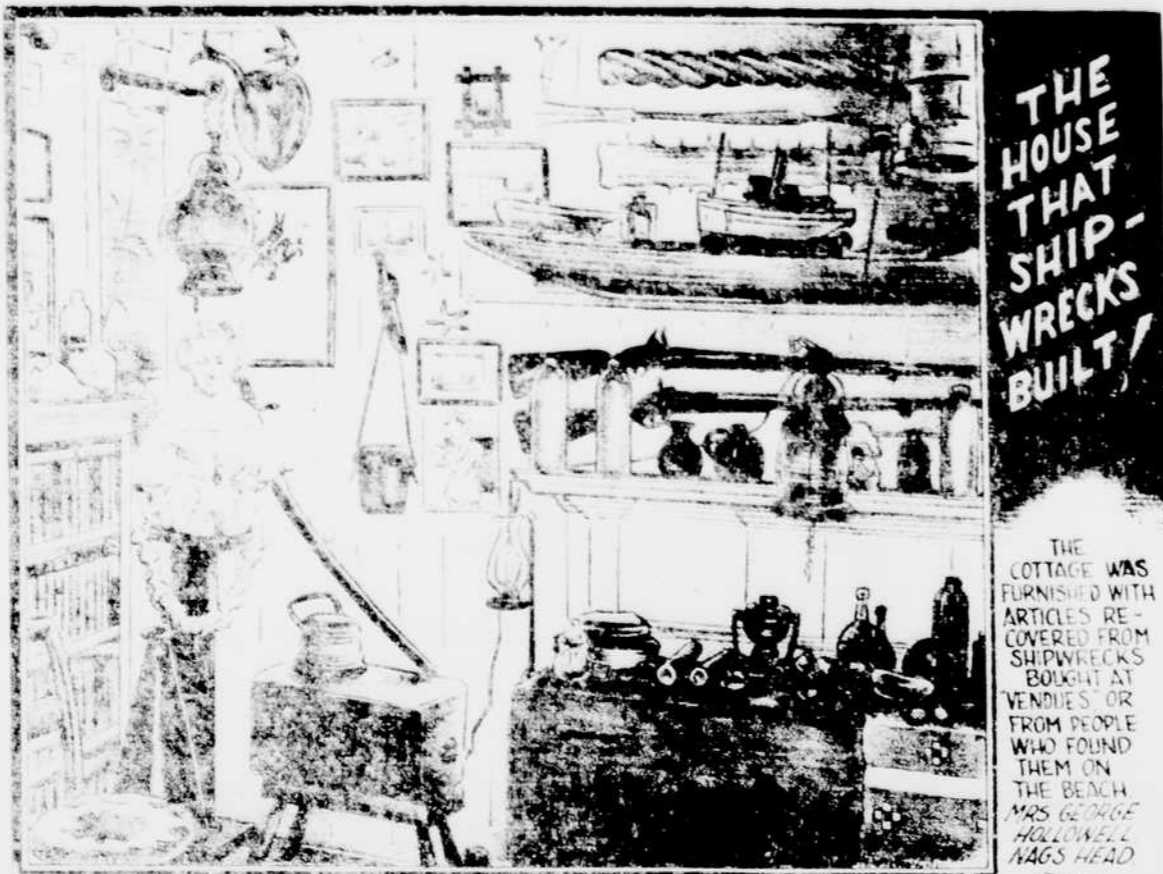


Final Total For Bonds Is Awaited
