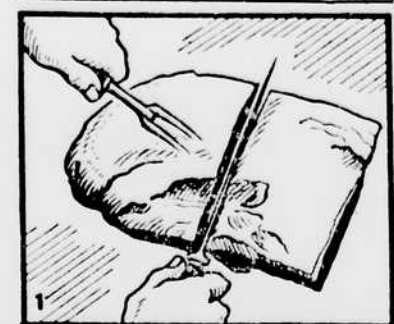

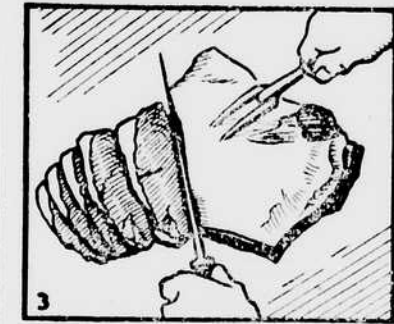
TO CARVE BRISKET



1 Place whole cooked brisket with fat side up, and rounded side away from carver. Divide brisket into two pieces.

BARCLAY ON BRIDGE

A LIVING POST-MORTEM RUBBER BRIDGE players during the post-mortem of a hand, chiefly speculate on what would be the result if somebody made a different bid or play. Duplicate enthusiasts have an advantage over them, for usually in a big game with a lot of tables it is possible to see exactly what happened when such a bid or play was made. One point on which evidence accumulates is that of No Trump versus suit contract when a game is in the cards at both.

South made that last bid of 3-No Trump because the game was match point duplicate and he reckoned that might edge out the people who bid 4-Spades at that stage. The evidence deduced by the action was far from conclusive.

Par, for all to try to beat, was the natural result of 4-Spades bid and 5-Spades made, only two tricks being lost in diamonds, as a con-

ple of North's hearts were parked on the clubs of the South hand. That produced a score of 450 points, 150 for tricks plus 300 for the duplicate game bonus.

People who made two extra tricks at 3-No Trumps lost that, with 450 points, but those who got only one extra trick were below it, with 430. Where a diamond was led to the K, the A laid down and a third diamond returned, South got 11 tricks. Where a heart was led, or a diamond followed by a heart switch, South took only 10.

With a deal like this, however, there should be no argument at all in rubber bridge, regardless of post-mortems or anything else. The correct rubber contract is 4-Spades, which is immeasurably safer especially since South's diamond stopper was not sure protection of the suit at No Trumps.

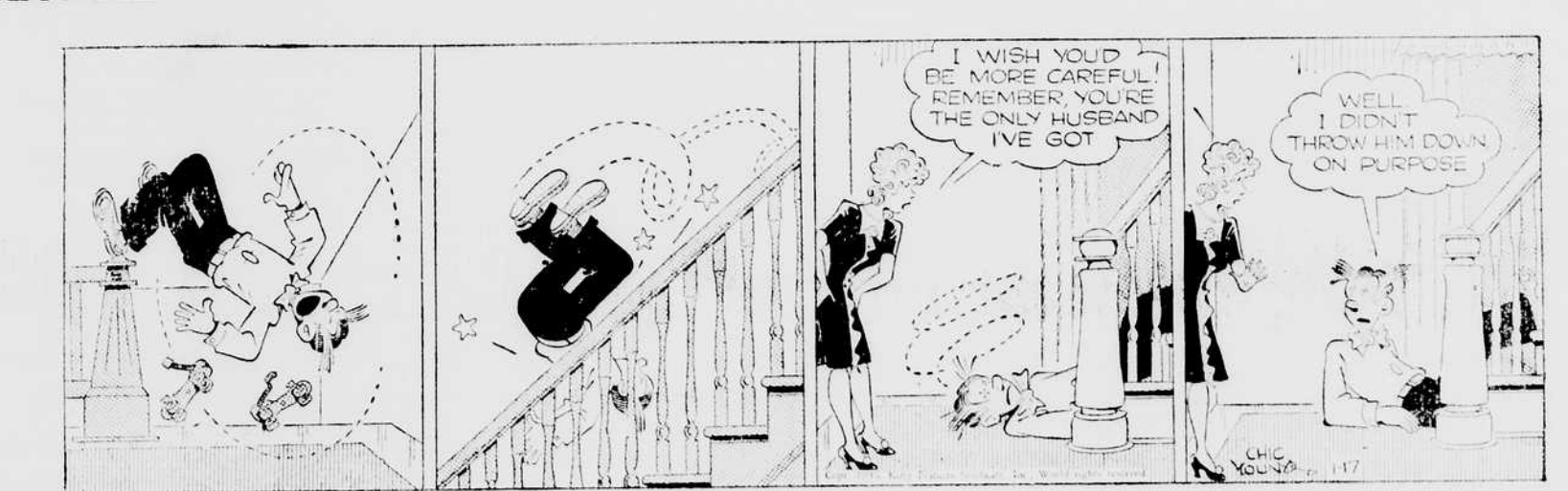
