BARCLAY ON BRIDGE

DANGER ON ONE SIDE
"CANNON TO right of them,
cannon to left of them" volleyed
and thundered in the famous
"Charge of the Light Brigade."
Sometimes a declarer is beset with
tricks in all directions, but there
are many other times when his
real peril is entirely to one side,
to the right or to the left. He must
not let that particular defender
get in the lead because the return
of a certain suit by him can run
the contract. In that event, he
should play so that, if he loses the
lead at all, it will be to the de-
fender whose return cannot be dis-
trous.

find the clubs wouldn't break. To

As soon as you see worn spots on the
chows of a garment or in other places
that get hard worn, do some preventive
darning to make the garment wear longer
and to save yourself more trouble later
on. Use matching thread, sew it in
and out to look as much as possible like
the material.

He decided to finesse spades. He
scored the K, then led the 10, cov-
ering with the J. East won that,
returned a heart through the Q and
the contract went down three,
with the defense getting one trick
in each black suit plus four in
hearts.

Sound planning would have told
South his great danger lay in let-
ting East get the lead to come
through his heart Q. So he should
have plotted any finessing toward
West. The most valuable finesse
would have been in spades. So,
after winning with the heart A,
he should have finessed the spade
10, taken the spade K, led to the
club A, run the rest of the spades
to make his contract sure, then
tried for a club break with the K.
When that failed, he would have
his contract safely made by just
leading to the diamond A.

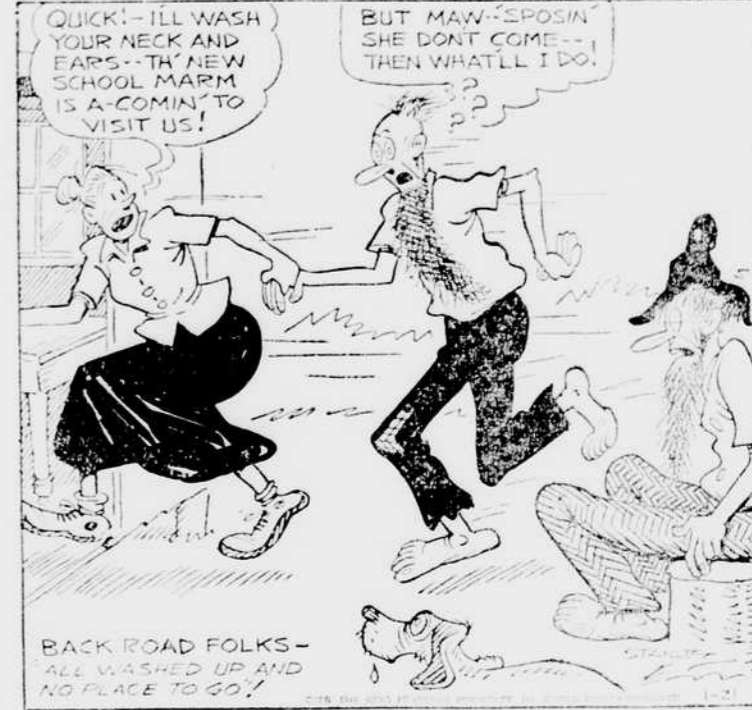
