

Schools Again Suspended Because Of The Weather

With rural schools already suspended "indefinitely" because of weather and road conditions, Henderson city schools also suspended this afternoon until Wednesday morning because of poor attendance.

Superintendent E. M. Hoff said the average attendance in the city schools today was only little more than half. Children who reported for classes were kept until lunch period, however, and then sent home until Wednesday, when a further effort will be made to substitute.

Rural schools were closed most of last week and have been most of the time since Christmas, but those in the city have been attending regularly, except they were suspended early last Thursday due to the

Bates Says Yanks In China To Be Stabilizing Force

Tientsin, Jan. 21.—(AP)—American forces probably will be kept in North China as a stabilizing force now that the renunciation of the Japanese has been turned over to the Chinese. Rep. Bates (R-Mass), a member of the House Naval Affairs committee, said here today.

Bates is in Tientsin with a naval committee subcommittee.

"Changes may be kept here some time longer as a stabilizing force with the good offices of the Government are being used to recon the two Chinese forces to peaceful settlement."

"We are interested in a permanent world peace. We are of the opinion that unless we hold a hand another world fight may be in the making."

Ten Days Remain For Tax Listing During January

Only ten days remain during the prescribed period of the month of January, during which 1946 taxes must be listed, and listings were lagging sharply. State law provides that property shall be registered during the month of January as of the first day of the month.
