

Local Library Receives New Books As Memorial

Among recent gifts to the H. Leslie Perry Memorial Library are two books in memory of the late Mrs. Effie Miller Moore, "Colonial Churches of Tidewater Virginia," by George Carington Mason, historian of the Diocese of Southern Virginia, was given in memory of Mrs. Morris by Miss Mary Belle Gary, Miss Cornelia Gary and Mrs. E. R. Austin. This beautifully printed volume is illustrated with the author's own maps, drawings

and photographs. The territory covered by this work includes the Eastern Shore and the southern colonies of Tidewater Virginia. The book will be a significant addition to the knowledge of the churches and of the social and religious development of Colonial America.

In memory of Mrs. Morris, The Women's Society of Christian Service, First Methodist Church, has given "Album of American History, 1783-1833," edited by James Truslow Adams. The book contains more than 2000 well selected illustrations. It is rich in pictures, authentic pictures that tell more and quicken the imagination more than many pages of written text. The average American will find this one of the best introductions to a real understanding of American social history.

A volume featuring the paintings of the famous American artist, Mary Cassatt, has been given to the library in memory of Mrs. Katharine Diane Perry by Mr. and Mrs. Richard Gary. This monograph contains eight reproductions in full color as well as numerous lithographs in black and white. Among these are many portraits of mothers and children which was the favorite theme of the artist.

"The Earth is the Lord's," a Tale of the rise of George Washington, by Taylor Caldwell, has been given in memory of Robert Dale Wolf, by his mother, Mrs. Lawrence B. Wolf. "The Robe," by Lloyd C. Douglas, and "The Emperor's Physician," by J. R. Perini, were given in memory of Edward K. Fleming by Mrs. Ernest K. Fleming.

In memory of Captain Robert M. Bennett, 114th Infantry, 29th Division, 8th Army, who was killed in Germany on November 29th, 1944, Mrs. R. G. S. Davis has given a large volume of fine photographs, including "The U. S. A. at War, U. S. Campaign, 1943." The photographs cover a period of the important campaigns of the war. Mrs. Davis has also given the library a copy of "Memories of an Old-time Tar Heel," the autobiography of Kemp Plummer Battle, president of the University of North Carolina, 19-1901, edited by his son, William James Battle, Professor of Business Law, in the University of Texas.

Eligible Men Now May Apply For Army Commission

It is now possible for those men who are eligible to apply for and obtain a commission in the Regular Army, according to information received today.

Public Law No. 281—28 December 1945, authorized the Department of Defense to increase the commissioning authority of the War Department.

Any male citizen who served on active duty from January 1, 1941, to January 1, 1946, and who was honorably discharged on or after December 1, 1941, and 28 December 1945, and who has completed the necessary requirements, is eligible for appointment.

Eligible men who have served as officers between discharge and commissioning may also apply for commission in the Regular Army. Any D-1 listed in the Department of the Government to accept a commission.

It is possible to be commissioned as Second Lt., First Lt., Captain or Major, depending upon age and length of service.

These are the important facts for officers who have been separated from the service at a wish to apply for a commission in the Regular Army.

1. Applications must be submitted in time to reach the Adjutant General's Office, Washington, 25, D. C., not later than 1 March 1946. Applications received by the Adjutant General, Washington, 25, D. C., after 1 March 1946, will not be considered.

2. Applications may be made on WD AGO Form No. 62. Requirements of the "Red Head" regulation have previously submitted in application or had in any other way made a statement of interest in such application.

3. Applications may be obtained at any Army installation, including Army Recruiting Offices.

4. Officers who wish to apply in the Army must submit their application directly to the Adjutant General's Office, Washington, 25, D. C.

Applications and complete information may be obtained by going to any Army post, company, unit, station or recruiting office and applying for information regarding application for regular Army commission.

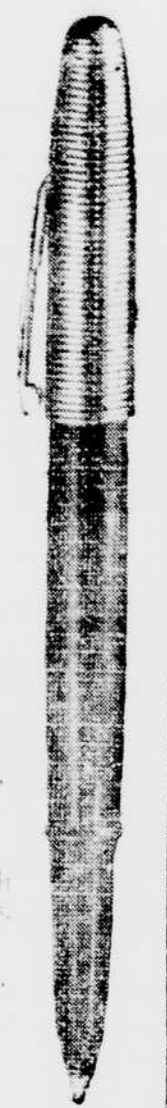
