Gets Look at Land.
Moses was told to get up into the top of Mt. Pisgah, and take a good look at the promised land, but that "they shall not go over this Jordan."
"And now, O Israel, hearken unto the statutes, and unto the ordinances, which I teach you, to do them; that ye may live, and as in and possess the land which Jehovah, the God of your fathers, giveth you."
"Behold, I have taught you statutes and ordinances, even as Jehovah my God commanded me, that ye should do so in the midst of the land whether ye go to possess it." Ever since Horeb Moses had been teaching his people how they should live in the land to which they were going. "Keep therefore and do them; for this is your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the peoples, that shall hear all these statutes, and say, Surely this great nation is a wise and understanding people."
What other people, asked Moses, had heard the voice of God and had been given so many evidences of His care? "For what nation is there so great, who hath God so nigh unto them, as the Lord our God is in all things that we call upon Him for?"
"Only take heed to thyself, and keep the seal diligently, lest thou forget the things which thine eyes have seen, and lest they depart from thy heart all the days of thy life; but teach them thy sons, and thy sons' sons."
Worship Without Idols.
Living as they would, among idolatrous people, these Israelites were to be an example of righteous living, showing in their day-by-day actions, and in their sacred books and their solemn rituals, how God's people lived. They were to worship God without images, which alone would set them apart, from their idol worshipping neighbors.
It always was a temptation to the Israelites to worship idols. In spite of the admonitions and warnings of their prophets, and their commandment from Jehovah that He would not tolerate worship of any but Him, they still wanted to bow down to something they could see, and so transgressed.
Jehovah had driven "out nations from before thee greater... mightier than thou, to bring thee in, to give thee their land for an inheritance, as at this day."
"Know therefore this day, and lay it to thy heart, that Jehovah He is God in heaven above and upon the earth beneath; there is none else." Moses reminded them.
"Observe and hear all these words which I command thee, that it may go well with thee, and with thy children after thee for ever, when thou doest that which is good and right in the sight of the Lord thy God."
