lions of little air sacs that pass the exygen from the air to the blood. When these air sacs become stretched or dilated, the condition is called pulmonary emphysema. According to Doctors Edgar Mayer and Israel Rappaport of New York City, this condition is often the first sign of gradual heart

They think that the increasing number of people who are suffering from this condition is due to the increasing incidence of heart disease in the middle-aged population, as well as to exposure of modern industrial workers to dust, vapors and fumes.

X-Ray of Chest

Pulmonary emphysema is diagnosed by an examination given by the doctor, together with an X-ray of the chest. On examination, it is is, the breathing movements are restricted. There are also wheezes and whistling sounds during breathing. The X-ray will show certain areas of the lungs which are overdistended.

As emphysema continues, cough, shortness of breath, and a bluish color to the skin known as cyanosis, develop. During its early stages, known as the first period, this disease may go unrecognized for years. The second period, in which there is difficulty in breath-ing, as well as some circulatory failure, may last for from two to six years. Sooner or later there may be gradual failure of the heart, due to the strain put on it by the breathing difficulty.
