

J. M. Peace Files For The Senate

Another contest for the Democratic primary developed today with the filing by J. M. Peace of his candidacy for the State Senate. Peace served one term in the House of Representatives in 1937. He has practiced law in Henderson for twenty years or more.

In the primary contest he will oppose W. W. White, who last year represented the county in the State Senate—in 1937 and 1941. Vance, Warren and Southston counties constitute the third senatorial district.

Only other office for which a contest has been filed is that of register, for which Frank Williams announced a week ago. He will oppose H. M. Robinson, incumbent, who has held the office for eight years and is regarded as an efficient candidate for reelection this year.

The deadline for nomination by the board of elections is Saturday, April 13, and it is expected there will be a flock of entries before that time.
