Group Approves Unification Of Armed Services

Washington, April 8. -- (AP) -- A three member sub-committee to-day recommended legislation to the Senate Military Committee to abol-ish the present War and Navy De-partments and create a single new "Department of Common Defense." The action served to make public the proposed bill.

The measure is intended to carry out President Truman's requests for unification of the armed forces. Drafted after months of closed door sessions, the bill would raise the air force to equal rank with the Army and Navy and place all three under a single new cabinet member, to be known as the "Secretary of Common Defense."

FALSE CARDS A GAMBLE

MAKING a false-card in order to fool the defenders is consider-able of a gamble, which some-times works and sometimes does not. Whether it misleads them or not depends usually on two fac-tors. One is the keenness of your adversaries. The other is the re-mainder of the information which is in sight to the defense or to one particular member of that pair. In some situations, your false-card is so transparent that they can't help reading it. In others it is almost sure to deceive them.

Did you ever see a funnier opening bid than that? The only excuse was that South, quite a good but fancy player, had a partner who was playing bridge for the very first time, and South feared he might possibly have a game and get dropped shy of it.

With the defense having no in-formation whatsoever about the declarer's distribution in other suits, or the dummy's either, and neither partner knowing a thing about his partner's hand, West de-cided to open his singleton club. Noting in a flash that he had be-

tween his hand and dummy the K, J and 10, South was ready to pounce on his K as soon as East, after a bit of study, played the A. South could read easily that the card was a singleton, since he him-self had the J, but to East it looked exactly as if West had led from five clubs headed by the Q-J and South really did have a single-ten K. So East refused to return a club and thus set up dummy's 10 for a discard! He instead picked the diamond K.

That was won by the A, then the heart A, Q and K were taken and the spade 2 led. East played the 10, the K won, and all that the defenders could get thereafter was the spade A. South therefore scored an extra trick.

If East had returned the club suit after the first trick, West would have ruffed, would have put East back in with the spade A, and a second club ruff would have set the contract.
