SHOW ANIMALS NOT UNDER OPA CONTROL

College Station, Raleigh, April 18.—H. L. Meacham, marketing expert of the State College Extension Service, said today the new OPA-U. S. Department of Agriculture meat slaughter control program "is not expected" to affect the sale of animals at North Carolina fat stock shows.

Meacham said that he has received a letter from OPA officials eliminating from price ceilings and slaughter quotas all 4-H and 4-F animals consigned for sale at fat stock shows. OPA permission to hold such shows and sales is required, Meacham said, adding that the attitude of the price control agency to date has been "completely favorable" to the interests of farm boys and girls holding cattle for sale.
