Valet Safe Is Found By Youths In Tar River

Five white youths aimlessly testing locks in the Tar river just below the bridge between Kittrell and Frankton yesterday afternoon about 4 o'clock discovered the iron safe which was carried from Vance Cleaning Company Sunday night, March 31.

Charles Dickerson, Nelson Dickerson, Louis Garrett, R. Ward Garrett, and Tilden Johnson, all of Kittrell, route 2, were removing rocks in the river and when one of the rocks bounced back they went down the embankment and saw a safe wheel protruding from the water.

The youths then went into the water and discovered the safe, coming into Henderson to report their find to the police department. Officers accompanied the boys back to the safe, which had been opened at the bottom with an axe, and brought forth papers which had been stored in the safe. About \$400 in cash, which was also in the safe had been taken by the thieves. Nearly was found an axe, which presumably had been used to cut the safe.

The safe was not in the main stream of the Tar river, but was in one of the smaller streams, according to officers.

Tobacco Insurance Available For Vance Farmers

Tobacco crop insurance with "four new features" is now available to Vance County tobacco farmers on the 1946 crop, E. W. Wortham, chairman of the county AAA Committee, announced today.

Last year's operation of the tobacco insurance program — the first year of a three-year trial period — has resulted in a much improved crop insurance policy. Wortham said in pointing out that (1) the premium rates have been greatly reduced; (2) this year, instead of the tobacco's losses being figured on an over-all production basis, individual cropping units have been set up and losses will be paid on each cropping unit; thereby, making it possible for a landlord to be paid for losses along with each tenant; (3) the per cent coverage is provided in case occurs after harvest; and (4) partial coverage is available for farmers covered less completely at a lower cost.

Two types of contracts are being offered — "investment" and "quality." The investment type covers up to 75 per cent of the cost of producing a tobacco crop. The yield-quality type guarantees a return to an amount as high as 75 per cent of the average yield for the farm, computed on the average quality of tobacco produced on the farm.

The sales campaign is now being conducted throughout the county and will continue through April 25.

Any person interested in the tobacco crop at the time of planting is eligible to insure his interest in the crop.

All Vance county tobacco farmers are invited to drop by the AAA office if they have any questions about the program.
