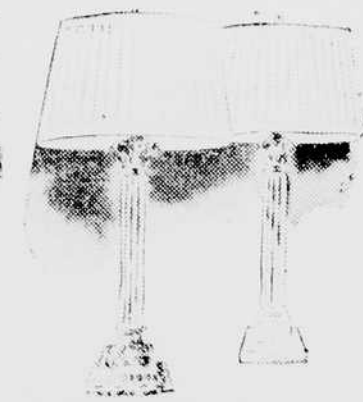

### May 12 Is 13th AAA Anniversary

Sunday, May 12, marks the thirteenth anniversary of the Agricultural Adjustment Act, commonly known today as "Triple-A," according to an announcement today by E. W. Wortham, chairman of the county committee.

"With the passing of the act on May 12, 1933, the farmer was given the right and the opportunity to influence the production, marketing and price of his own products. It also marked the beginning of planning for agriculture and the rewards of cooperative efforts by farmers of the nation," Mr. Wortham said.

Objectives of the AAA were named by Mr. Wortham as a fair share of the national income for farm families and a fair exchange value for farm products, conservation and wise use of agricultural resources, and safe-guarding consumer supplies of food and fiber.
