necessary. Then we ask that our sins be forgiven us as we forgive others their sins against us. If we do not freely forgive those who sin against us, how can we ask that our sins be forgiven? And by forgiveness is meant not only lip service saying we forgive, but really overlooking the offense and admitting the offender to the former friendship, or, if not that, at least, holding no grudge against him. We expect others to forget our transgressions completely, but only can we demand that if we also forget theirs.

Finds Them Arguing

Jesus had emphasized in His teaching and teaching of His disciples that a life of service was what He expected of them. If any man would come after him, let him deny himself and take up his cross, and follow Me. Even so, He found them arguing among themselves as to who would be greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

It seems impossible that those men who lived with the Lord, saw His self-sacrifice and heard His teaching, could stoop to such low an argument. And Jesus, observing the reasoning of these men, took a child and set him by Him, and said unto them, Whosoever shall receive this child in My name, receive Me; for he that is least among you all, the same shall be great.

Luke doesn't tell us what the disciples' reaction to this rebuke was, for John changed the subject, according to Luke. The little child, the most helpless and least intellectual of humans, was used as an illustration of the humility and love of self-sacrifice that Jesus expected of His friends and the hearts of His sons.

"And it came to pass, that, as they went their way, a certain man said unto Him, Lord, I will follow Thee, whithersoever Thou goest. And Jesus said unto him, Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man hath not where to lay His head."

Jesus had no home in the interior of His travels when He needed rest, sleep was no where. He could go Nazareth, but said His out. He had left Capernaum, the Samaritans refused to receive Him. He wanted this man to realize, not Christ's poverty, but the wandering life of self-denial he would be forced to lead if he followed the Master.

Carolina Coach To Have Special Buses To Manteo

Manteo, June 14.—The Carolina Coach Company will operate a special bus from Charlotte to Roanoke Island this summer for each performance of The Lost Colony, which is being revived at the old Fort Raleigh for its sixth season. It was announced today by W. G. Humphrey, the Raleigh traffic manager of the company.

Humphrey said the bus would leave Charlotte at 8 a. m. each day on which a performance is scheduled and follow a route through Salisbury, High Point, Greensboro, Burlington, Edenton, Hartford, and Roanoke Island, arriving in Manteo about 6 p. m. in time for the performance. The bus will leave the city at 8:15. Carolina Coach has agreed with other bus companies that tickets for the Lost Colony express may be purchased at any bus station in the State, with the exception of those including the express. Special tickets to the Roanoke Island show are being sold at a special rate of \$1.00 for the round-trip, including the cost of rooms for an overnight stay in Manteo. Humphrey has made arrangements with the Roanoke Island Historical Association for reservation of the rooms and theater seats for 37 persons each evening of the show. It is contemplated that the return trip will include a visit to Wright Monument on Kill Devil Hill, where the Wrights flew.

Two buses on which the company expects delivery within the next few weeks will be used on the run. The buses will be inaugurated on July 1 for the fourth performance of the Lost Colony, which opens on June 26 and will continue until Sept. 2, the closes for the season on September 2.
