With the granting of a total of 18 divorce suits, the civil session of the June term of Vance Superior Court came to an end Monday afternoon.

Two divorce actions in addition to those given in the forenoon Monday were in suits brought by William S. Knight against Rosa Jarrel Knight, and Dwight Overton against Nellie Grey Moore Overton.

In an ejectment suit by A. L. Parker against W. H. Jenkins, the order of the court was to vacate the premises by September 1 and pay the costs of the suit.

This was the third session of Superior court in Vance county in the first half of 1946, a seasonal session having been held the first three days of last week by Judge Parker.

Only one regular term, a mixed court, is scheduled for the first half of 1946, that to be held at Raleigh, presiding.

N. C. STATE FACULTY AND STUDENTS MORE

Raleigh, June 25. —State College will have a faculty of approximately 235 members, the largest number in the history of the institution, before opening of the fall school term September 27, it was reported yesterday by Chancellor John W. Harrelson.

Registrar W. L. Mayer also expects an all-time record student enrollment, probably exceeding 4,000. The college permanent faculty roster now approximates 225 deans, professors, assistants, associates and instructors — five higher than ever before — with a salary outlay of about \$842,000 per year, including an approximate \$72,000 for annual clerical help.
