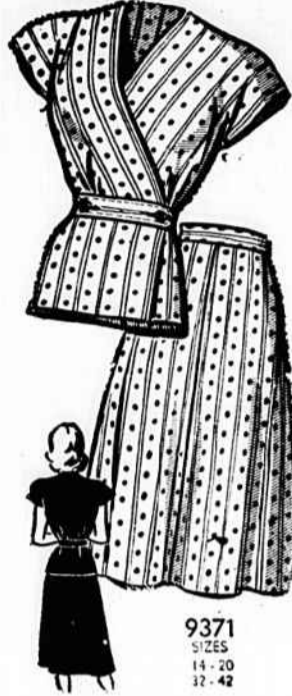

AUTO LICENSE TAGS NOW AT HALF PRICE

North Carolina State automobile license tags for 1946 were reduced to half price as of July 1, with half of the year gone, the local Carolina Motor Club license office said today. Motorists who buy new or used cars may now obtain their plates for the remainder of this year at half price. The reduction, however, does not affect licenses for "farmer" trucks, special half-price tags issued to trucks used for farm purposes. The price of "A" trailer plates are likewise unchanged. The fifty per cent slash applies to all other types of license plates.

U.N.C. HOUSING UNIT NEARS COMPLETION

Chapel Hill, July 4—The first colony of 178 government surplus housing units being erected on the Mason Farm Road the campus is expected to be ready for occupancy by the opening of the September quarter, construction officials have informed University authorities.

Married veterans who are students at the University will occupy most of the apartments in the area, but 15 of the units have been reserved for faculty members who also are veterans.

Since June 3, when the first concrete foundations were laid, foundations for 16 buildings, which will include about 120 apartments, have been laid, and frames have been nailed to 24 individual units.

Henderson won in the thirteenth frame: Warrick singled to left field; Mills bunted him to second; Allen walked; Johnson got an infield hit to fill the bases. With the Romancos infield practically on top of home plate, James Kittrell laid down a perfect bunt to score Warrick on a squeeze play.
