Are Not Listed Sixty-seven Vance county men are included in the War Depart-ment's official list of dead in World War II, but or additional 16 accre-dited to navy casualities are not given in the summary. Records com-piled here show a total of 83 white and colored military men were kill-ed. died of disease or otherwise least their lives while in the service. In preparing the list, the War Department used letters to indicate the type of casualty. Explanation of those letters follows: KIA-Killed in action. DOI-Died of wounds. DOI-Died of each which in-cludes stekness, accidents outside combat areas, etc. FOD-Finding of death, which in-cludes men who were narracel as missing for the required period w of time usually a year and then were declared as dear. 
