Avirett's Great Oration.

DELIVERED AT WINCHESTER, VA., SEP-TEMBER 17TH.

At the Laying of the Cornerstone of the Monument to be Erected in Memory of the North Carolina Confederate Dead-Tribute to the Women of the South-Eulogy of Charles Broadway Rouss and Touching Reference to His Double Affliction-North Carolina's Part in the Late

The following extract is made from the oration of Rev. James Battle Avirett, at Winchester, Va., Sept. 17th, at the laying of the cornerstone of the monument to be erected in honor of the North Carolina Confederate dead there buried in Stonewall Cemetery. The speaker was introduced in an apt and felicitous manner by our dist'nguished townsman Col. W. H. Cheek, late Colonel of the First North Carocitizen, in these words:

Kind friends of the City of Winchester:-

There are with you today a few citizens of North Carolina who have made a pilgrimage to this sacred spot, to unite with you in the performance of a very pleasant duty.

We have come to join with you in adding one more tribute to the memory of our comrades who laid down their lives upon the aliar of their country, and died in defence of our homes. We have come with an orator capa-

blc and well prepared to perform this task. Before I introduce him, I beg that I too as a representative of our HINDERSON NORTH CAROLINA people may be permitted to avail myself of this apportunity to express to the noble, patriotic, generous and loving women of this historic old town. our sincerest thanks for the untiring zeal that they have manifested in the collection of the remains of our dead comrades, and in giving them decent burial in this beautiful cemetery, and for their constant care in the preservation and decoration of their graves.

I now present to you the Reverend James Battle Avirett, who needs no introduction to this people, and who has been selected by the Ladies' Memorial Association of our State to ad-

Mr. Av vett began his address, which was pitched on a high key, admirably wrought and eloquently expressed, with a tribute to the women of North Carolina for their heroism and devotion from the early sectlement of Roanoke Island down to the present, including records of the land you loved and the darkest hours of the late civil war. 
