This is the third one that has recently been sent to jail, and there is never a term of court that there is not one or two up here charged with some grave crime.

"And I can't understand why it is that officers of the government continue chaffering with criminals and scheming to get them off light. I want to serve notice now and here that this is the last one of these defaulting postmasters that will be sent to jail. Hereafter they will go to the penitentiary. This man would have gone there but for the pleadings and solicitations of public officials and others in his behalf."

People who have been in court watching the proceedings say that they are the officers of the government who are to blame for this. Judge Purnell had reference to his remarks was little Claude Melnott the Bernard, who imagines he fills the office of District Attorney, and who has recently been mighty busy rubbing off the blots these negro officials have put on Senator Pritchard's fine record.
