This catalogue shows for this session the large total attendance of 524 students. Of this number 391 are enrolled in the Academic Department. The Professional Schools have a total enrollment of 138, divided as follows: The Law School 64, the Medical School 42, the School of Pharmacy 32. This is the largest enrollment in the history of the institu-

The facilities of the University have been greatly increased by the construction of two new dormitories, which will accommodate 150 students and a building for recitation rooms. The total cost of hese buildings will be \$65,000. The increased appropriation of the Legislature will make possible an increase in the teaching force and additional equipment which will insure the best work. Excellent waterworks are in full operation and a central heating plant will be installed before the beginning of the next


