The sheriffs of those counties, as well as those of all other counties of the State, have received within the on the subject from Governor Glenn, which ought to wake them up to a fuller realization of their duty in the premises and cause them to speedily become active in seeing that these governor's letter does not have this effect some of the sheriffs of this State will soon find themselves figuring as defendants in the courts; for the Governor has also within the last week publicly invited the people and the newspapers of the State to report all cases coming under their knowledge where the liquor laws are violated, solicitors of the districts shall vig-orously prosecute the officers of the counties in which these laws are not enforced. The United States Commissioner,

Ex-Congressman John Nichols, is authority for the statement that Uncle Sam's agents receive absolutely no assistance from the county authorities when they go after illegally operated distilleries or blind tigers; that this has always been so, and that the passage of the State laws referred to above, whereby it is now as much the duty of the county and State officers to suppress these vio-lations of the State laws as it is for the revenue agents of the Government to destroy them because they violate the Federal statutes, has not made a particle of difference in the attitude of the sheriffs and their deputies of the moonshine counties. This commissioner has violators of the liquor laws before him almost constantly, not a few of them arrested here in Wake county, in the very shadow of the legislative halls at the capitol where the Ward and Watts laws were recently enacted. But who knows of a single illegal distiller in this entire State that has been arrested and punished by the county authorities? It certainly least of it, that the Governor has just mailed to these sheriffs and it is to be hoped that it will have a salutary effect. If not, then by all means let's have the prosecutions of the worse than inefficient officials-or

Carlisle, and resolutions were adopted as follows: "To reduce the cotton acreage of 1905 ten per cent. this year; authorizing the township organizations to impose a tax of ten cents on each bale grown by every member of the association for the support of the organization; authorizing the president of the county association to employ a county organizer; endors-ing the bill of Senator Overman now pending in Congress.

Dockery declared that he believed the best way to solve the problem of additional farm labor was for all farmers to redouble their efforts to grow larger families and depend upon home labor. Secretary Connor of the North Carolina Teachers' Association announced yesterday that the executive committee of that association has decided to hold the annual meeting this year in Raleigh, and that June twelth to fifteenth has been decided on as the time.
