Applications For Rehearings. Sec. 6. That a new section be added

to said act immediately after section 16, to be numbered as section 16a, as

follows:

"Sec. 16a. That after a decision, or der, or requirement has been made by the commission in any proceeding any party thereto may at any time make application for rehearing of the same, or any matter determined therein, and it shall be lawful for the commission in its discretion to grant such a rehearing if sufficient reason therefor be made to appear. Applications for rehearing shall be governed by such general rules as the commission may establish. No such application shall excuse any carrier from complying with or obeying any decision, order, or requirement of the commission, or oper ate in any manner to stay or postpone the enforcement thereof, without the special order of the commission. In case a rehearing is granted the proceedings thereupon shall conform as nearly as may be to the proceedings in an original hearing, except as the commission may otherwise direct; and if, in its judgment, after such rehearing and the consideration of all facts, in cluding those arising since the former hearing, it shall appear that the original decision, order, or requirement is in any respect unjust or unwarranted. the commission may reverse, change, or modify the same accordingly. Any decision, order, or requirement made after such rehearing, reversing, changing, or modifying the original determination shall be subject to the same

Free Passes For Railway Employees. "Sec. 16b. Nothing in this act shall prevent any common carrier subject to Its provisions from giving free transportation or reduced rates to the officers of the organizations of such employees for the purpose of transacting the business of such organizations with such railroads; Provided, that such reduced rates or free transportation are not issued with the view of discriminating in favor of or against any particular class of employees."

Annual Reports From Common Carriers. Sec. 7. That section 10 of said act be

amended so as to read as follows: "Sec. 20. That the commission hereby authorized to require annual reports from all common carriers subfect to the provisions of this act, and from the owners of all railroads engaged in interstate commerce as defined in this act, to prescribe the manner in which such reports shall be made, and to require from such carriers specific answers to all questions upon which the commission may need information. Such annual reports shall show in detail the amount of capital stock issued, the amounts paid there for, and the manner of payment for the same; the dividends paid, the surplus fund, if any, and the number of stockholders; the funded and floating debts and the interest paid thereon; the cost and value of the carrier's property, franchises, and equipments; the number of employees and the salaries paid each class; the accidents to passengers, employees, and other peramounts expended for improvements each year, how expended, and the character of such improvements: the earnings and receipts from each branch of business and from all sources; the operating and other expenses; the balances of profit and loss; and a complete exhibit of the financial operations of the carrier each year, including an annual balance sheet. Such reports shall also contain such infor mation in relation to rates or regulations concerning fares or freights, or agreements, arrangements or conmission may require, and the commission may, in its discretion, for the purpose of enabling it the better to earry out the purposes of this act, prescribe a period of time within which all common carriers subject to the provisions of this act shall have, as near as may be, a uniform system of accounts, and

The commission shall at all times have access to all accounts, records, and memoranda kept by carriers subject to this act, and it shall be unlawful for such carriers to keep any other accounts records, or memoranda than those prescribed or approved by the commission, and it may employ special agents or examiners, who shall have authority under the order of the commission to inspect and examine any and all accounts, records, and memoranda kept by such carriers. This provision shall apply to receivers of carriers and operating trustees.

Forfeits For Disobedience.

"In case of failure or refusal on the part of any such carrier, receiver, or trustee to keep such accounts, records, and memoranda on the books and in the manner prescribed by the commission, or to submit such accounts, records, and memoranda as are kept to the inspection of the commission or any of its authorized agents or examiaers, such carrier, receiver, or trustee shall forfeit to the United States the sum of \$500 for each such offense and for each and every day of the continu ance of such offense, such forfeitures to be recoverable in the same manner as other forfeitures provided for in this

Imprisonment For False Entries.

"Any person who shall willfully make any false entry in the accounts of any book of accounts or in any rec ord or memoranda kept by a carrier, or who shall willfully destroy, mutilate, alter, or by any other means or device falsify the record of any such account, record, or memoranda, or who shall willfully neglect or fail to make full, true, and correct entries in such ac counts, records, or memoranda of all facts and transactions appertaining to the carrier's business, or shall keep any other accounts, records, or memoranda than those prescribed or ap proved by the commission, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of com petent jurisdiction, to a fine of not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$5,000, or imprisonment for a term not less than me year nor more than three years, or both such fine and imprisonment. Fines For Indiscreet Examiners.

'Any examiner who divulges any fact or information which may come to his knowledge during the course of such examination, except in so far as he may be directed by the commission or by a court or judge thereof, shall be subject, upon conviction in any court of the United States of competent jurisdiction, to a fine of not more than exceeding two years, or both

"That the circuit and district courts of the United States shall have juris diction, upon the application of the attorney general of the United States a the request of the commission, alleging a failure to comply with or a violation of any of the provisions of said act to regulate commerce or of any act sup plementary thereto or amendatory thereof by any common carrier, to !s sue a writ or writs of mandamus com manding such common carrier to com

ply with the provisions of said acts, or any of them.

"And to carry out and give effect to the provisious of said acts, or any of them, the commission is hereby authorized to employ special agents or examiners who shall have power to administer oaths, examine witnesses, and re ceive evidence.

Bills of Lading.

"That any common carrier, railroad, or transportation company receiving property for transportation from a point in one state to a point in another state shall issue a receipt or bill of lading therefor and shall be liable to the holder thereof for any loss, damage, or injury to such property caused by it or by any common carrier, railroad, or transportation company to which such property may be delivered or over whose line or lines such property may pass, and no contract, receipt, rule or regulation shall exempt such common carrier, railroad, or transportation company from the liability herein imposed: Provided, that nothing in this section shall deprive any holder of such receipt or bill of lading of any remedy or right of action which he has under existing law.

"That the common carrier, railroad, or transportation company issuing such receipt or bill of lading shall be entitled to recover from the common arrier, railroad, or transportation company through whose negligence the loss, damage, or injury shall have been sustained the amount of such loss, damage, or injury as it may be required to pay to the owners of such
