We have seen grass and weeds grow in strange places, but there is a sight Mecklenburg mineral waters are at Young's wood yard the like of sold in Henderson by M. Dorsey, which we have not seen before. It is a vermifuge weed six inches high. growing on top of an old iron safe. There is a slight indentation in the iron and here the seed germinated, took root and flourisheth. 
