## Japanese Tobacco

Now Manufactured and Sold Exclusively by a Wise and Far-Seeing Government.

Attention is called in the July *Everybody's*, by Charles Edward Russell, in an interesting instalment of "Soldiers of the Common Good," to the recently established Japanese tobacco monopoly.

These matters and the Japanese purposes become clearer if we take concrete illustrations. Manufactured tobacco and cigarettes, for instance. Once we enjoyed an abundant trade with Japan in these things for we had thought her to be the land that supplied her wares at high prices. Thus in the end Japan served copiously to swell the hard-earned treasures of the American Tobacco Trust, for the Japanese were industrious consumers and the trust could charge what it pleased, leaving the trade by the throat. But when the trust had established branch houses and offices and works and invested in them \$12,000,000, the Japanese Government concluded that it might as well have the goods by the throat and let the trust have them, so it went into the tobacco business on its own account. It bought factories and stores and passed a law establishing itself in a practical monopoly of the tobacco trade, for no makers of cigarettes, cigars or tobacco were allowed to sell their products until they had been offered to, and declined by, an agent of the government—a necessary provision, because in Japan cigarette-making is largely a domestic trade. It will therefore have been left to the American trust a chance to compete in quality of product or in some special lines if it had not been for one thing. The government put an import duty of 250 per cent on cigarettes and tobacco. Thereupon the American cigarettes and tobacco were almost entirely supplanted by the Japanese Government.

**A Republican Refuses Office.**

A North Carolina Republican declines a Federal office which pays two thousand dollars salary and several hundred in fees annually. This is a statement hard to believe; yet such an announcement is made from Washington. When all the circumstances are known, the appointment for the same reason that Mr. W. R. Henry turned down the tender of the consulship to Curacoa. The latter gentleman "would not stand a country where yellow fever, green lizards, and horned frogs are the principal products." No doubt, like Mr. Henry, Mr. Pearson thought his abilities and past services to the party should receive greater recognition, and that he would have had, in his opinion, deserved or would take nothing. While Mr. Pearson may think he deserves a much better position, the one offered him is, as far as surroundings are concerned, far preferable to the one Mr. Henry turned down. Tasmania lies about as far South of the equator as does North Carolina to the North of it. From the Century Dictionary and Encyclopedia we find the following description of the place: An island and British colony in Australasia, situated South of Australia, separated by Bass straits, capital Hobart. Its surface is largely mountainous or hilly. It has good agricultural resources and mine of gold, tin, etc., and exports wool, coal, etc. It is the seat of the States of the commonwealth of Australia, under a governor legislative power being vested in a council and assembly, both being elected. The aborigines are extinct. Area 29,385 square miles, population 177,340.

Hobart, the capital, lies in latitude 40°52' South, and has a population of about 25,000. So it will be seen that there are not near so many objectionable features to this appointment as to the one tendered Mr. Henry and with which the *News and Observer's* correspondent compares it. But it is a mighty long ways from Burke county—just about as far as it were possible to get without taking to the clouds. It must be very near Burke's antipodal point on the earth's surface. Under these circumstances one is not surprised that Mr. Pearson declined the appointment. The life in Australasia would not suit a person raised in the mountains of North Carolina.

**Laughter as an Aid to Digestion.**  
Nothing else will take the place of cheer and laughter at meals or any other time in the home. There is a vital connection between amiability and digestion—between good cheer and assimilation. Laughter is the best friend the liver has, and depression, or melancholia its worst enemy. Numerous experiments have shown that mirth and cheerfulness stimulate the secretion of the gastric juices, and are powerful aids to digestion. Yet, knowing this, many of us sit at the table gloomy and depressed, as if at a funeral; in many homes, scarcely a word is spoken at meals, outside of requests for an article of food. The meal hour ought to mean something besides supplying the animal function. The bell which calls the family to the table ought to be a signal for a good time generally, when all cares should be thrown off and everybody appear at his best. He ought to signalize the time for mirth and laughter. It ought to be looked for rarely to be the members of the family as the recess or nooning is looked forward to by pupils in school, as a let-up from the strenuous life.
