For some years past, the Southern Railway Company has maintained an industrial magazine known as the Southern Field. It is published under the management of Mr. M. V. Richards, land and industrial agent of the Southern, and is attractively illustrated and carries each month a considerable amount of literature of a valuable character in regard to the South and its resources.

During the year there were completed and put in operation 594 new industries, having a combined capital of \$32,219,450. Additions were made to 126 manufacturing already in operation at a cost of \$12,539,580.

The total amount invested in industrial enterprises was \$47,595,530, and the grand total investments in industries and in the general city and town improvements aggregated \$127,253,385.

The plan is to keep the fund intact for all time, and to make no disbursements from it in the form of gifts. The end in view is to loan, not give, assistance to worthy young women who could not otherwise obtain the money with which to pay their expenses at the college.

The plan of organization requires that a strict and separate account be kept of the money derived from each county and loaned to young women from the county by which it was given.

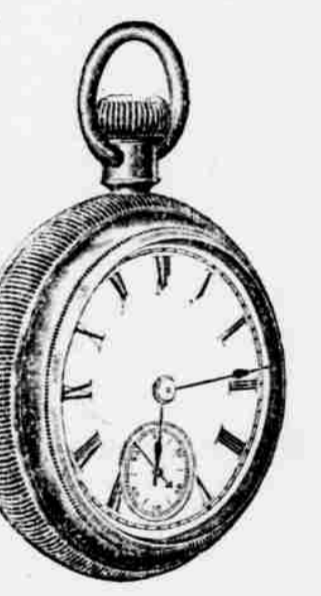
