**WILSON MURDERER CAUGHT.**

Lewis West, Negro, Desperado, Who Killed Deputy Sheriff Mumford and Seriously Wounded Chief of Police of Wilson Captured at Maxton.

Maxton, N. C., Feb. 11.—Lewis West, whose bloody trail has been followed persistently since his heinous murder of Deputy Sheriff Mumford and the dangerous wounding of the chief-of-police of Wilson, N. C., about ten days ago, was arrested here last night by Chief of Police Dunlap, and is today safely incarcerated behind the bars in Raleigh.

With nine loaded revolvers upon his person, the negro whose savagery was evidenced when he continued to fire into the prostrate form of his victim at Wilson, after he was shot down, calmly sat in a negro restaurant here and ordered supper. Secure in the belief that his personal arsenal was sufficient to resist arrest he reckoned not with the power of the law and failed to realize the hatred all men here bore him.

Without giving the murderer a chance to escape or to use a weapon Chief Dunlap covered him with a revolver and demanded surrender. With the negro it was a quiet surrender into the hands of the officer or a quick entrance into the great beyond, for Chief Dunlap's finger quivered just a trifle as it pressed the trigger of his trusty revolver. His hand was steady, however, and his voice was that of a master speaking to a slave.

Crowd into submission the negro was handcuffed and searched. Wound after wound was taken from his person, in every pocket he carried a pistol. In the bosom of his shirt he had two ath-letic shoes concealed. First showing his identity, West made a pretense of braggadocio, but when stripped of his weapons and surrounded by men who were positive in the identification, the negro admitted he is Lewis West and made a full confession of the horrible crime, a crime for which the punishment will be death.

Officers from Wilson arrived this morning and the negro was hurried to Raleigh to prevent any attempt on the part of angry citizens to take the law in their own hands and deal out summary justice to the black fiend. He was utterly subjected when he was placed aboard the train. For the first time since he shot to death Deputy Sheriff Mumford and later wounded Chief of Police Dunlap, the negro seems to recognize the aggravated nature of his crime.

After mortally wounding Deputy Sheriff Mumford who attempted to arrest him, the negro again fired into the helpless form of the prostrate man shooting him in the head as he lay on the ground.

Rushing to the assistance of his fellow officer the chief-of-police was fired upon and a wound inflicted that was at one time thought to be fatal, but later developments have proved that the wound is not so dangerous.

The negro immediately made his escape. Those who were his accomplices were arrested but West managed to elude every officer until last night. Telegraphic communication with every city in North Carolina and with all cities in other states put the entire detective and police machinery of the country on the trail of the murderer, and his arrest here by Chief Dunlap is regarded as a clever piece of work by this brave officer who faced the negro with nine revolvers and placed him behind the bars.

Raleigh, N. C., Feb. 11.—In custody of Chief-of-Police N. H. Dunlap, of Maxton, Sheriff Sharp of Wilson, and a posse of guards, Lewis West, the negro who killed Deputy Sheriff Mumford and dangerously wounded Chief-of-Police Clover at Wilson is locked in the penitentiary here. They arrived from Maxton this afternoon at 12:30 on Seaboard Air Line No. 66.

**BILL NYE DAY CELEBRATION**

In the Public Schools of North Carolina—Interest of the Bill Nye Memorial Building at the Stonewall Jackson Manual Training School.

The following letter explains itself: Raleigh, N. C., Feb. 1, 1911.

To the County Superintendents and the Public School Teachers:

The public press of North Carolina has always responded generously and unselfishly to every call of the public schools for service, and no agency has been more potent in promoting the development of these schools and the progress of education in the State. The county superintendents and the public school teachers now have an opportunity to express their appreciation of this service, and to render at the same time a valuable service to a most worthy cause by cooperating heartily with the "Bill Nye Memorial Committee" in their commendable effort to raise funds for the erection of a central or main building at the "Stonewall Jackson Manual Training School," to be known as the "Bill Nye Memorial Building."

The Committee has prepared an interesting program for the celebration of Bill Nye Day in the public schools. An hour devoted to honoring the memory of such a man, who loved all children and all men, who devoted his splendid talents to making them happier and better through his writings, will be properly and profitably spent.

I earnestly request and urge the county superintendents of each county to distribute these programs to the public school teachers of the county, accompanied by a letter to each teacher, directing the setting apart of an hour in the school for this celebration, and urging the hearty cooperation of the teacher for the success of the celebration.

The noble work of the Stonewall Jackson Training School for giving wayward boys of the State a chance to have a chance to be trained into good citizens should appeal strongly to the hearts of the children of the public schools, who but for the mercy of God might be like these wayward boys. It is a privilege, therefore, for these children to have an opportunity to make a contribution to such a work. It will do them good. I earnestly urge, therefore, that county superintendents and teachers lend their hearty cooperation in securing at least a penny contribution from every child in the Bill Nye Memorial Building for increasing the facilities at the Stonewall school for training wayward boys.

I designate Wednesday, the 22nd day of February, for this celebration. I suggest that the teacher devote an hour on this day to reading to the pupils this booklet and to arousing an enthusiastic interest in Bill Nye and his work and in the work of the Stonewall Jackson Training School, concluding the exercises with an earnest appeal for a contribution of at least one penny from every child to be brought next morning. All contributions should be forwarded by the teacher or the principal of the school to Mr. R. W. Vincent, Secretary of the Bill Nye Memorial Committee, Charlotte, N. C., and they will be acknowledged in the columns of the Charlotte Observer.
