THE ELACKWELL CASE

Will be Heard in State Courts—Free-man Jones to be Hanged. Durham, N. C., September 3.—The interesting litigation and the hard fight which is brewing between the Daskwell Durkar Daskers Company Blackwell Durham Tobacco Company, of North Carolina against the American Tobacco Company, and the Black-well Durham Tobacco Company, of New Jersey, is to be given a hearing in the North Carolina State courts, this being the decision of Judge Fred Moore rendered at Durham after the proceedings of the suit had been thoroughly reviewed by him. The main friction in the litigation, is that the newly chartered Blackwell Company, of this state is suing to prohibit the old company from manufacturing "Bull Tobacco" in North Carolina. The argument neard in this city last week by Judge Moore, was for the removal of the case to the Federal court, the object of which the defendant made an effort to get the case out of North Carolina. 
