

# SECOND SENSATION IS SPRUNG TO-DAY NEAR LEXINGTON

Excitement of Yesterday Over Killing of Foreman Eubanks by Negro Intensified this Morning by Open Threat of Another Negro to Kill Foreman Bueler.

Bueler and Posse Chased Negro and Finally Succeeded in Capturing Him. Taken to Sheriff's Office. Excitement Intense. Chase of Negro Gaddy Fruitless.

Lexington, Oct. 8.—The excitement yesterday over the murder of Foreman Eubanks had barely cooled before it was fanned into white heat this morning by another negro of the camp openly threatening to kill Foreman Bueler, one of the best men on the road. Mr. Bueler heard of the threats and immediately went for the negro, who ran and a large posse immediately pursued.

The fugitive had run into the home of Mr. David S. Conrad, frightening his family, who dared not protest against his entering the house. Word was sent to the crowd, who lost the scent and in a few minutes the negro was safe in the sheriff's office.

The two incidents coming so close together have not brought about a pleasant situation here. Pursuit of the negro Gaddy yesterday ended in failure at nightfall. All three of him was lost. The bloodhound failed to make good. There is where the negro got the start and escaped. The whole country side joined in the pursuit. Farmers afoot, horseback and in vehicle armed with all sorts of weapons joined the regular posse until there must have been a thousand men scouring the woods.

Time and again the trace of the negro's bare foot was seen in the soft earth. Once or twice the officials actually got around in front of the fugitive, turned back and missed him. The better class of colored people here are loud in their denunciations of these criminals and go beyond the whites in their desire that summary punishment be administered. They say that these outbreaks make trouble for them and include the innocent with the guilty in the opinion of the white people.

## DEATH OF COL. T. H. BAIN.

Number of State Officials Leave to Attend Funeral. Raleigh, Oct. 8.—Governor Glenn and party returned from Newport News, where they attended the launching of the new cruiser North Carolina. They were delighted with their trip. The governor declares that he never enjoyed a trip anywhere so thoroughly. A number of state officials leave this evening for Goldsboro to attend the funeral of Col. T. H. Bain, Inspector General of the North Carolina National Guard at 10 to-morrow morning. He died last night from the effects of a stroke of paralysis.

## PACIFICATION OF CUBA.

Is Now Practically Complete Through-out Island With Exception of Santa Clara. Havana, Oct. 8.—The reports received by the provisional government show that the pacification of Cuba is practically complete with the exception of the province of Santa Clara, where matters are rapidly nearing settlement. The only trouble known to exist is at Alquizar, a province of Havana, but it is believed the 30 rural guards there will be able to keep peace. A closer examination of rifles surrendered by the insurgents shows very few of them are fit for anything but the scrap heap.

# GREAT SCARCITY OF LABOR IN MILLS

Cotton Mills in Rhode Island in Great Need of More Laborers. In Some Mills Many Looms Idle for Lack of Operatives. The Situation.

Providence, R. I., Oct. 8.—The cotton mills agents in Rhode Island complain of the scarcity of help in some departments and assert that in this respect the increase in wages granted early last summer did not have the beneficial result hoped for.

The increase has not thus far drawn back a sufficient number of those who left the mills when the wages were lowered and when there was dissatisfaction among the workmen—for other reasons.

In some mills, at the present, more looms are stopped than has been the case heretofore in the history of the industry in this State. In one large mill there are said to be 600 looms idle while a few years ago the number of applicants for work exceeded the demand. A fifth of the looms in another large mill are said to be stopped for want of operatives. This scarcity of labor has brought about keen competition among the mill officials in offering inducements to families of workers to become permanent help and foreman and second hands are employed constantly in looking for new hands.

In some instances the expense of removing the families and their household belongings from one village to another has been paid by the mill management, so eager are they to secure experienced hands, who can be depended on to remain permanently.

## MARINES LANDED.

Cruiser Brooklyn Landed 350 Marines—Work of Disarming Insurgents Nearly Complete. Havana, Oct. 8.—The cruiser Brooklyn this morning landed 350 marines, who went to Camp Columbia. The battleships Kentucky and Indiana will sail this afternoon for New England waters. No further reports of trouble in any part of the island have been received. The disarming of the insurgents is practically complete, with the exception of small, isolated bands, who will be disarmed by the rural guards.

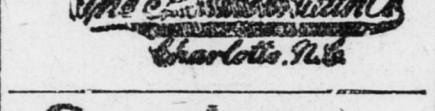

## 1500 WOMEN AROUSED.

Thought Doctors Were Cutting Throats of Their Children.

New York, Oct. 5.—Believing that the "murders doctors," as they called the board of health physicians, were cutting the throats of their children in the public school, in Williamsburg section of Brooklyn, 1,500 women, nearly all Italians, stormed the school building in a mad effort to reach their little ones today.

Before the riot was quelled several policemen were seriously injured by the infuriated women and one of the rioters had to be arrested. For several days the physicians of the board of health have been examining the eyes and throats of pupils. Contagious affection of the eyes had spread from the homes of Italians in the vicinity of the school.

# SPANISH-AMERICAN WAR VETERANS MEET

Practically Every State in Union Represented at Third Annual Encampment of Organization of Spanish American War Veterans which Opened To-day.

Washington, D. C., October 8.—Spanish-American war veterans from practically every State in the union are in attendance upon the third annual encampment of the organization which began its sessions here today. The first session was a joint meeting of United Spanish war veterans and the national auxiliary of the organization. Commander-in-Chief Charles R. Miller, of Ohio, called the session to order, Father A. H. I. Roney, National Chaplain, pronounced the invocation. Henry B. E. MacFarland, president of the board of district commissioners, welcomed the delegates and their comrades in Washington. Commander-in-Chief Miller responded to the welcoming address. He then submitted his report for the year. He reviewed his personal work as Commander-in-Chief and said he was assured there was a great awakening of interest in the organization, especially in the South, many camps now are being formed. An tentative agreement has been entered into between Commander Miller and Commander Walker of the legion of the Spanish war veterans of the legion of Spanish war veterans of Massachusetts, providing for the consolidation of the two organizations. It probably will be ratified at this encampment. The Massachusetts organization has about 4,500 members. Commander Miller recommended that, in the South where there are many negroes eligible to membership in the organization, separate camps and separate departments be organized for the white and for the black members. The financial condition of the organization, Commander Miller added, was good, all bills being paid and the balance of \$2,400 in the bank. While it was not possible for the commander to report the precise membership of the United States Spanish War veterans, he said it approximated 45,000.
