### The Southern Indicted.

On Tuesday afternoon the grand jury returned into court as a true bill the bill of indictment sent against them charging that the freight depot on its present site is a nuisance. This strikes at the very heart of the matter and if there is a conviction which seems in every way probable, it will no longer be a question of providing adequate facilities but the railroad will simply be compelled to tear down the depot that they have there and build a new one elsewhere. The case will come up for trial at February term of court. The railroad seems determined to pay no attention to the decision made hitherto and after a consultation between Mayor Elliott, the Aldermen and City Attorney Hufham, the matter was turned over to the criminal side of the docket.
