MILITARY RECOMMENDATIONS.

Boards Asks for Increase in Adjutant's Salary and Small Compensation for Captains.

Raleigh, Dec. 15 .- Adgt. Gen. T. R. Robertson this afternoon gave out the recommendations for changes in the law by the military board that has been in session here for the past iew days.

Among other things the board will recommend that each captain be paid \$100 a year, as the law now is the captain is required to look after the appurtenances of the company, without any compensation for his trouble and expense.

The organization of signal corps is aiso recommended, to be composed of representatives from each town. An increase in the salary of the adjutant general is also asked for with the recommendation that he be required to live in Raleigh. Of course the recommendations have to be passed on by the legislature before they become a law.




