

Jerome Opens Rebuttal To-day in Thaw Trial. witnesses on Stand

Jerome and his Associates, After Strenuous Work, have Case Worked Out. Rebuttal Begins.

He Identified Letter Given Him by Mrs. Thaw. The Ethel Thomas Case. The Testimony Given at To-day's Session.

New York, March 11.—District Attorney Jerome will begin the presentation of the evidence in the rebuttal in the trial of Harry Thaw today. His object will be to combat the contention that Thaw was insane at the time he shot and killed White. Since the adjournment the district attorney and his assistants have worked night and day getting the case together. Their work was carried on all through Sunday and when night came Jerome said he was now ready to proceed. Mrs. William Thaw will be constantly present at the trial until the verdict is returned. She has taken charge of her son's case with a greater assumption of authority than she has shown before.

Longfellow on Stand. The first witness called by Jerome was Frederick W. Longfellow, one of the Thaw family attorneys, who was called by the defense some time ago to identify certain letters which Harry Thaw wrote to him in 1903. Jerome wanted him to identify a letter handed him by Evelyn Thaw upon her arrival from Europe late in 1906. Longfellow met Mrs. Thaw at the ship Oct. 24th. Mrs. Thaw on witness stand, said she could not fix the date or name of the steamer. Longfellow said he had acted as Thaw's attorney for some years prior to June 25, 1906.

"Did you represent this defendant in the suit of Ethel Thomas against Harry Thaw?" asked Jerome. "My firm handled the case," said Longfellow.

"Were the papers served on this defendant?" Again Delmas objected. Justice Fitzgerald sustained the objection.

Jerome Taken Down. In the argument on his objection, Delmas quoted from Jerome's statement when Evelyn Thaw was on the stand, that her testimony was permissible only as showing the state of Thaw's mind, and that he would not be allowed to contradict it.

Delmas said: "We told him we would have no objection to his attacking the truth of his wife's story." "Now do you object?" snapped Jerome. "I am not trying to show that Ethel Thomas' accusations were true," said Jerome. "That would be a collateral fact. Anyway, this poor girl is now dead."

Delmas objected here to reference to the Thomas girl, as a "poor girl," and the statement that she is now dead. "Mrs. Thaw herself testified that she is dead," said Jerome, who withdrew the adjective "poor."

Continuing, Mr. Jerome said: "Mrs. Thaw herself says she was told the story of Thaw trying the young woman to a bedpost, and beating her. That is the story of Ethel Thomas." Delmas protested: "I must seriously object to the learned district attorney testifying in this case."

Justice Fitzgerald then ruled sustaining the objection to the testimony as to whether the papers in the Ethel Thomas case were served on Thaw.

Jerome Enters Protest. "Did there come into your possession at any time letters written by this defendant to Ethel Thomas?" asked Jerome.

Delmas objected on the ground that any such letters must have been written prior to 1903 and therefore had nothing to do with the sanity or insanity of the defendant.

"Why, your Honor," said Jerome, "the defense has traced this man's disease back to measles and mumps. We ought to have some right to show his condition down to 1903. The defense has put into evidence such parts of his life as they chose from his nursery days in an attempt to show him insane. May I not go into other portions of his life to show he was sane?"

Delmas here objected to further questioning of the witness as to Ethel Thomas suit on the ground that Longfellow at the time was acting as Thaw's counsel.

"Of course," said Jerome, "if you are going to plead professional privileges as a bar I cannot go ahead. Mr. Justice Was Riled

The Speaker of the House Told the Senate Just What he Thought of Senate Won Fight However.

Raleigh, N. C., March 11.—The State Senate finally won out in the anti-trust legislation fight which has been on the past week. The Senate today voted to strike out the Justice amendment, adopted in the House Saturday night, with a view to forcing the American Tobacco Company out of the State then sent the bill back to the House for concurrence.

This was done after a fiery speech by Speaker Justice in denunciation of the course of the Senate and declaring he would have the Senate roll call on this legislation in the next State Democratic convention, the purpose being to carry the trust fight into the party conventions. It is expected the assembly will adjourn for the term about 6 o'clock this evening.

WILL PROHIBITIONISTS WIN? Election Being Held at Knoxville On Liquor Question—Thousands of Prohibitionists Parade Streets. Knoxville, Tenn., March 11.—An election is being held here on the question of repealing the municipal charter for the purpose of eliminating the saloons.

A parade composed of about 5,000 men, women and children, appealing for anti-saloon votes, passed through the business section this morning. A very heavy vote is being polled and both sides are confident of victory, though the indications point to a large temperance majority.

GRAIN STILL IN HAND. Bulletin Issued Showing Amount of Corn, Wheat and Oats in Farmers' Hands. Washington, March 11.—The crop reporting board of the agricultural department in a bulletin, reports the amount of wheat in the farmers' hands March 1st, was 206,644,000 bushels or 28.1 per cent of last year's crop. The amount of corn on hand 1,298,000 bushels, or 44.3 per cent of last year's crop. Oats on hand 384,461,000 bushels.

BOMB ARTIST ACTIVE. Man Who Threw Bomb at Colonel Deumabazze Suicided. Valta, Crimea, March 11.—Col. Deumabazze, commandant of the garrison here was slightly wounded and his adjutant and coachman seriously injured by a bomb thrown at the colonel's carriage from an upper window in a house on the street through which he was driving. The man who threw the bomb committed suicide.

C. At the request of the North Carolina authorities Will Evans, another negro, was arrested also for the murder of Lewis and is being held in Norfolk, pending further investigation in Edgecomb where the grand jury has only acted against Davis.

According to the officer who took Davis to Tarboro, the only connection Evans is known to have had with this crime is through the charge of Davis.

CONFERENCE ON IMMIGRATION. South Carolinians Confer With President With Regard to Right of States in Matter of Immigration. Washington, March 11.—Ex-Governor Heyward, of South Carolina, and Commissioner of Immigration Watson, of that State had a talk with the President about the recent decision of the Attorney General and the attitude of the administration respecting the question of the right of a State to assist in immigration. Later a conference will be held when the Attorney General will be present. Commissioner Watson will sail tomorrow for Bremen for a conference with the North German Lloyd officials, with the view to the establishment of regular steamship lines to Charleston for carrying passengers as well as freight.

SAVED A STUDENT SKATER. Princeton, N. J., March 8.—E. Melvin Uplikie, a Princeton student, broke through the ice of Cold Springs Lake while skating today and A. Y. Striker, who was superintending the cutting and removal of ice near by, ran to his aid. He crawled to the edge of the broken ice and tried to seize Uplikie, but Uplikie sank. Striker ran back to shore and returned with a fence rail, and as he was working this over the space of clear water the ice gave way under him and he floundered in the water beside Uplikie. He managed to gain a firm grip on the rail and worked himself along it until he could seize the drowning man. No one was near to aid him, and it was half an hour before Striker got his heavy burden out of the water. Uplikie was unconscious, but was resuscitated.
