C., and was a present from George III. It is also expected to get the use of relics from Hampton, Va., which are the rarest of the kind in this country.

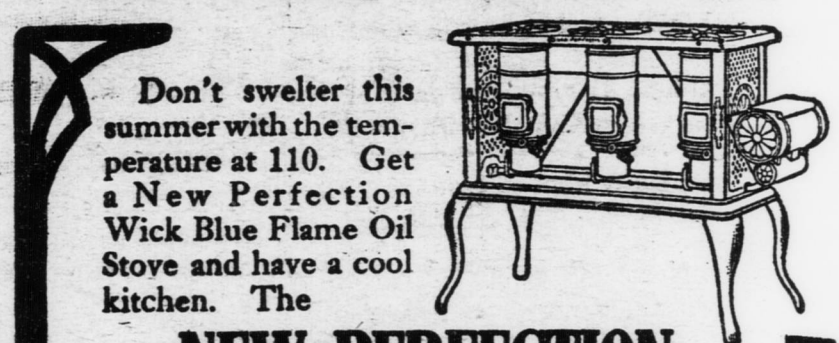
