D Elliott stated the position of Hickory at the conference of the railway officials and citizens so well that we take the liberty to quote him. "The track on the north side of depot was declared a nuisance by a Catawba county jury, but no remedy was provided. The Supreme court of the State declared it a nuisance, but the track still stayed there. The Corporation Commission ordered it moved, but the officials paid no attention to the order. 
