#### Charged With Smuggling Pearls Into This Country

New York, Sept. 27 .- The importation of three packages of pearls valu-There are quite as many imitations ed at \$10,000 wholesale, and alleged by among people as among manufactured the government to have been sumggled into this country several weeks ago, is being investigated by the customs authorities.

Manuel Cornejo, a California dealer in pearls, owns the gems which were shipped to Paris by way of New York and subsequently brought back again through this city. The customs officials at San Francisco, besides making a charge of smuggling against Cornejo, have begun a civil suit for the forfeiture of the pearls, on the ground that the 10 per cent duty to which they are subject on importation was not paid. Receipts of the New York customs

house show that Cornejo shipped some pearls to Paris and reshipped them back here, and he contends that these are the pearls found in his possession. The customs officials say that, even if there was a reshipment, the pearls are of Oriental origin and the defendant must show that duty was paid on their first entry into this country. The owner declares that while the pearls pass in trade for Oriental gems, they are really of American origin.
