# Legislature and Rate Bill.

The legislature now has under consideration the proposed compromise of the rate law. Several independent bills have been introduced but the measure which substantially represents what will be adopted finally is said to be the Graham Bill. This makes a flat rate of 21 cents per mile and provides for two thousand mile tickets at twenty dollars or two cents per mile, all railroads which have in this State in the aggregate not more than one hundred miles of railroad will be allowed to charge three cents per mile this concession being made for the purpose of helping the short lines of the state that have a severe struggle for existence.

It is eminently proper that these small lines should have a more favorable rate because it is well known that they are barely able to pay runing expenses.

#### Left to The People.

The action taken by the Democratic legislative caucus in the prohibition question is wise and in accordance with Democratic principles.

The issue will be passed upon at an Election to be held next April 28th.

Already most of this State is prohibition territory. There are sixty-eight prohibition counties in the State as against twentynine in which whiskey is sold either in saloons or dispensaries.
