Special Census Agents to Be Appointed.

Between 1,600 and 1,800 persons will be appointed as special agents of the census bureau about January 1st next. it was announced today, and a practical test of the qualifications of applicants for such positions will be given on November 3rd, next, before the local board of civil service examiners in every State in the Union.

Applications will be accepted from women, but the opportunity for their appointment is slight. Chief special agents will receive \$4.50 to \$6 per day, while the assistants will receive from \$3 to \$4 per day. The chief special agents will employed from six to 15 months, and the assistants from three to six months.-Washington Dispatch.


