Titanic Sinks with 1,500 Men liner Titanic sank in three hours Monday morning with a loss of life of 1.500, one thousand greater than in any previous ocean disaster. There were 2,200 passengers and a crew of 800. Women and children were saved first in boats which were later picked up by the Carpathla. The Titanic cost \$10,000,000 and was consid-
