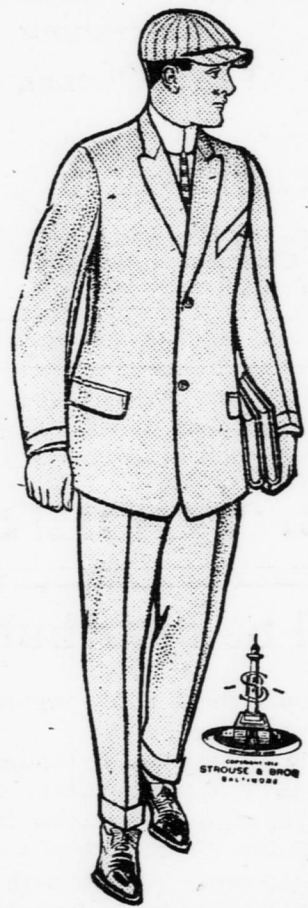

Mills.

Utica, N. Y. Observer refers to
Mr. E. C. Gwaltney, son of Mrs.
Gwaltney, of this city, who is
well known here and whose
friends will be delighted to know
of his promotion:

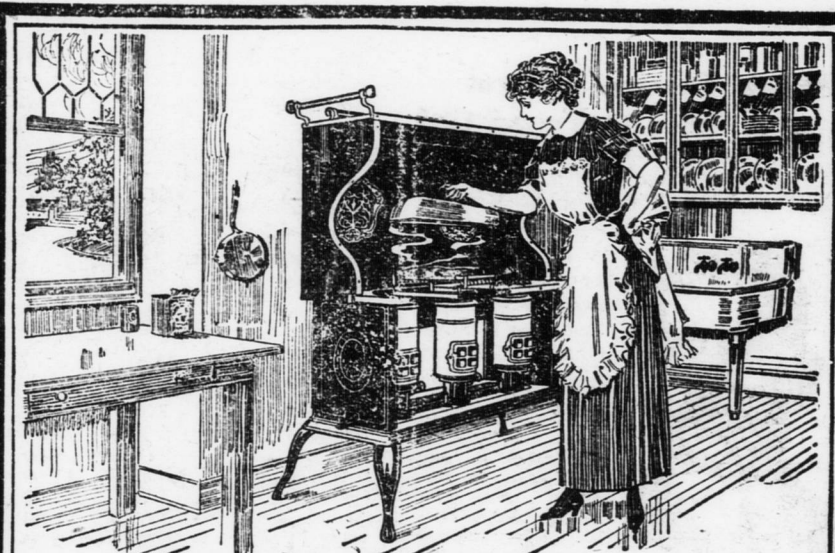
Superintendent George Fisk of
the New York Mills has resigned
his position and has been succeed-
ed by E. C. Gwaltney, for
several months past the super-
intendent of Mills 1 and 2. Mr.
Fisk will enjoy a rest before
resuming mill work. He has no
definite plans yet formed, but it
is expected that he will move his
family from New York Mills some
time during the summer. He
has been head of the New York
Mills plant for the past two years
and has done splendid work for
the company. Thomas H. Con-
ley, recently connected with the
Mohawk Valley Cotton Mills,
succeeds Mr. Gwaltney as super-
intendent of Mills 1 and 2.

Mr. Gwaltney, the new general
superintendent, is a young man
well fitted by training and ex-
perience for his position. Nine
years ago he was connected with
the carding department of the
Shenandoa Mills in this city, and
by his efficient work won re-
cognition as one of the best
superintendents in this vicinity.
After leaving the Shenandoa he
returned to his home in Winn-
boro, S. C., but last November
came here and accepted the
position of superintendent of
Mills 1 and 2 at New York Mills.
His efficiency and affability
quickly won him the confidence
of the officers of the company.
His promotion to the position of
general superintendent of the
Mills is a deserved one and his
friends will congratulate him
and wish him the best success
possible.

Business is booming at the
New York Mills plant since the
settlement of the big textile
strike there about a month ago.
All the old employes and a great
many new ones are at work. Day
and night forces are employed
and new workmen are being
hired every day.

Thousands of dollars' worth of
new machinery have been or-
dered for the mills, and it is the
purpose of the company to in-
crease its working force and its
output in a larger degree. Splen-
did grades of dress velvets and
corduroys are now being made
by the company, and a ready
market is obtained for these

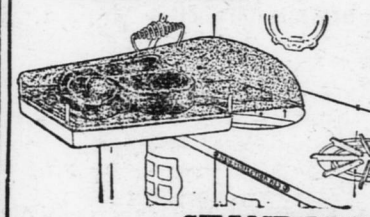

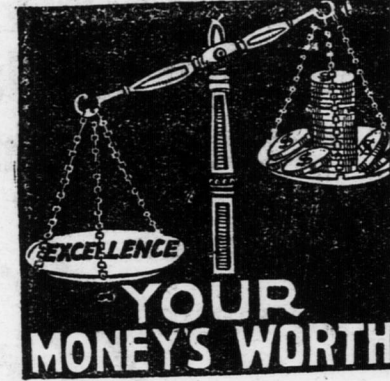

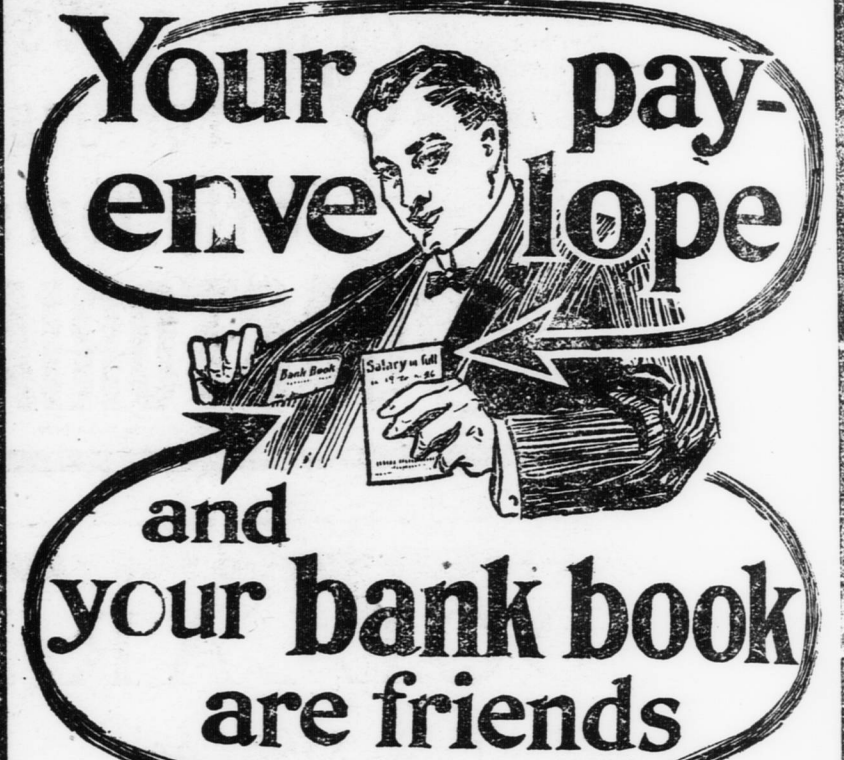
