The bill passed by the Senate increasing the borrowing capacity of building and loan associa-tions from 25 to 50 per cent. was amended by the House, which cut the amount to 30 per cent., and was passed. The amount of money paid in is to be the basis of the borrowing and not the a sets. The bill to define certain employments as extra-hazardous amended so as to apply only to employers of 25 or more laborers, was further amended by striking out the word "extra" and was then passed.

The House passed the following bills: To change the crime of temporary horse stealing by making it a misdemeanor instead of a felony; to allow mortmen at division points: to reduce imprisonment for horse stealing to four months; to authorize the Governor to appoint women no-

Bills defeated: To abolish kisoaths; to amend the laws as to the privy examination of married women; to prevent multiplicity of indictments.

The Senate committee on railroads decided to support favorably the resolution calling for a legislative commission to investigate the charges that a fraud is being perpetrated upon the State in connection with the Atlantic & Western Railway Co. in working the State's convicts near the Tennessee line, the State receiving in return stock of the company, which is alleged to be worthless. The accusation s made that a pretense of work being done, merely to keep any other road from using the mountain pass now occupied.

The Senate committee on education will report favorably the bill providing for uniformity of examination, certification and, graduation of teachers.

Up to the middle of last week less than 100 bills had been passed by the Legislature. In the house 600 measures have been introduced and in the Senate 400. The session is half over.


