SEGREGATION AND CLASSIFICA TION OF PROPERTY FOR TAXATION.

We note that by a majority re port, the committee on constitu tional amendments will recon mend to the extra session of ti legislature the segregation ar classification of property for th purpose of taxation. Their re port will also contain the add recommendation that in cases of segregation the rate of taxe shall be uniform throughout the districts in which the taxes ar

This step marks a very for ward and progressive advance in the right direction, and it is to be hoped that the Legislatur will adopt this recommendation in substantially the form in which it will be presented. In the al sence of information on a bette plan, it seems that the one which has been recommended will offe the best solution of the inequali ties which we have endured so long under the old system. The absurdities produced under ou present system of assessing rea property for purposes of taxation are so well known to everyonthat there is no need for any argument why it should be dipensed with. We have all lear ed that there is such a lack o uniformity in assessing reproperty that the burdens of supporting the state govern ment fall very unequally on the different counties of the state As a result of this valuations real property have fallen to the lowest possible minimum, anwe are unable to raise them hig enough to make a showing valuations that will meet the necessary requirements of the state and county government on our present rates of taxation. Nor can we much blame the assessors of the different coun ties, for with real estate assessed at 40 per cent of its actual value in Catawba County, and only 25 per cent in Mecklenburg county, it is easy to see that Ca tawba is paying 15 per cent morto the state treasurer on this class of property than is being paid by the people of Mecklenburg county on the same class. Under the plan of segregating property for the purpose of taxation, the Legislature will in all probability relieve the counties from taxes on real property for state purposes, and leave this as

county governments. Another evil of the present system which we have grown accustomed to is the inability to get solvent credits and other forms of personal property on the books for the purposes of taxation. It is to be hoped that by the adoption of a system of classifying property this evil will be very much remedied if not wholly eliminated. We know from the experience of states that have tried this plan, it is a great dea easier to get this property listed when rates of taxation are reduced; with the result that they have seen a very large increas in the revenue from these par ticular sources. The recommen dations of the committee certain ly suggest a much needed changand we hope that both the Legis lature and the people of the stars will endorse the recommendation as presented.


