Superintendent of Education John E. Swearingen has giver out significant figures as to the public schools of South Carolina. The enrolment figures show that for the entire State there are enrolled 193,247 negroes as against 167,914 whites. There are 332 white schools in the towns and 2,264 in the country, making a total of 2,596 schools for white children. Of the 2,451 negro schools, 199 are in towns and 2,252 in the country districts.
