Grim Reaper Busy.

Death decreased the government's civil war pension roll nearly ten per cent, during the ast fiscal year according to the innual report of Commissioner of Pensions Saltzgaber. A total of 396,370 union yeterans remained on the roll July 1, 33,255 less than a year ago. Payments to Civil war pentioners during the year totalled, \$156,669,771, compared with \$172,417,546 in 1914.

Pension office records show the total death toll since the close of the war has been 1,816,-995. In that periot the Federal government has paid to veterans, their widows and children \$4,-614,643,267.
